Leslie Hunter, the village representative, formally filed for the land. He was accompanied by Calista President Robert Schenker Chairmen of the Poord

Schenker, Chairman of the Board Raymond Christiansen, Calista Director of Land Planning Lewis Lively, and James Dugan, an at-torney for Calista, BLM State

torney for Calista. BLM State Director Curtis V. McVee signed the receipt of application. "Marshall is the first of 56 villages within the Calista Region to file for land under the 1971 Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act," said McVee. "From what

Ye seen of the application, it looks very good."

The Calista Region covers the Yukon-Kuksokwim Delta in western Alaska, and the village of Marshall is on the Yukon River approximately eighty miles north of Bethel. Marshall's village corporation,

Maserculiq Incorporated, is entitled to 115,200 acres of land with second, third, and fourth

This extra acreage will allow an extra margin to prevent loss of entitlement in case any lands

selected do not meet regulations.

The deadline for filing village land selections under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act is December 18, 1974.

Approximately 90 per cent of the applications need additional information. This notification gives applicants a chance to provide additional supportive

evidence for their application.
If no response is received from
the applicant, the claim may be rejected. Therefore, it is critical that an applicant contact the Bureau of Land Management with additional evidence or a request for instructions or clarification before the 60 day period

The Bureau of Indian Affairs and the regional corporation also receive a copy of the notice and field report. If the applicant needs help in preparing further information to support his claim, he should contact the BIA realty officer in his area. officer in his area.

In July Interior also directed BLM to provide training for adjudicators and field personnel about Native culture and traditional way of life. Additionally a joint BIA-BLM meeting was held in October to discuss solutions to mutual problems with tions to mutual problems with Native allotments.

During the meeting BLM and BIA personnel met with Natives from around the state to learn more about Native culture and traditional use and occupancy of Native land.
