Our involvement as Natives in State and National elections needs urgent, improvements throughout our entire state. Until all our our Native leaders (vi- lage-wise, district-wise, regional- wise, every-wise) make an effort to improve, we have nothing but disappointments ahead of us in statewide elections. I think most of us are very well aware that for every outstanding candidate we place to vie for higher and more effective office, we also give up another very important voice elsewhere.

Fundraising for campaigning is no longer just a big problem, but is an absolute must. Volunteers for campaign work must prepare for challenges from all walks of life. Planners for small village campaign activities must communicate to accommodate their favored candidates. We must learn to sacrifice both time and money to promote and fully amplify our voice in state and national affairs, because these matters involve our livelihood.

I am convinced that in order to fully utilize our most qualified, determined, and effective potential leaders, we must first familiarize all available voters with, and urge them to participate in all elections. ## The Situation of Village of Kijik

Dear Sir:

We would like to bring to your attention a situation concerning the Athabaskans of the Lake Clark area. The historic village site of Kijik lying midway up the northern shore of Lake Clark was the first village of the Tanaina Athabaskans in the Lake Clark area. The descendants of the people of this village, which was abandoned in the early 1900's, now reside in the village of Nondalton. A hand-hewn log Russian Orthodox Church and the village cemetery stood undisturbed on the site of Kijik for more than 70 years and were regarded by the people on Nondalton as a sacred and historical spot. In addition, the Bureau of Land Management had posted the area as a historic site "protected" by the 1906 American Antiquities Act.

Within the past several years, a Mr. Vernard Jones has intruded on the site. He has removed the BLM signs, destroyed three walls of the church, removed grave markers and has built structures on both of these areas. He is presently using the remaining end of the church as a storage shed. Though his 5-acre recreational site application was denied twice by the BLM, he has now succeeded in having the decision reversed and will eventually receive patent on the land unless protest is voiced. We feel that letters (refer to casefile AA.85 Jones) to the Secretary of the Interior, Rogers C.B. Morton, U.S. Department of the Interior, Washington, D.C. 20240 would be especially helpful at this time. This is probably only the first of many such cases of trespass and desecration of Native sites in Alaska and must be stopped now.

tribal community houses in Angoon has been announced by Alaska Division of Economic Enterprise (DEE) Director Richard Eakins.

"DEE Development Specialist Michael Ford put in a year of work trying to match up the need for funds and the source of funds," said Eakins.

The Alaska American Revolution Bicentennial Commission, under its heritage program, became the prime supporter of the project with grants totaling \$5,715 for each of the two tribal houses set for restoration.

Those buildings selected for work are the raven house Shteen Hit, and the wolf-eagle house Noow Hit.

Angoon leaders have also listed twelve additional tribal community houses that seem to be suitable for restoration as additional funds become available.
