This project will consist of grading and drainage on 1.1 miles of the Nome-Taylor highway and construction of a 180 foot bridge across the Nome River. All work is located near Nome, Alaska.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 145,000 tons of borrow; 30,000 tons of selected material; 6,000 tons of subbase, grading C; 2,200 cubic yards of Class IIA riprap; and miscellaneous roadway items of work. The bridge structure items provide for either steel and concrete alternative or treated timber. Under the steel and concrete alternative the following items apply: Class A concrete, reinforcing steel and structural steel, lump sum, all required; 1,200 shear stud connectors; 723 linear feet of cast-in-place concrete piles; and 400 linear feet of metal bridge railing. The timber alternative provides for the following: structural steel, lump sum, all required; 603 steel pipe piles; treated timber, lump sum, all required; and 375 linear feet of beam type guard rail. Both bridge alternatives include removal and disposal of the existing Nome River Bridge.
