

Land Use Planning

The Joint Federal-State Land Use Planning Commission will hold public hearings in Fairbanks on May 17 and May 18 at the Alaskan Civic Center.

A provision of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act is to set aside up to 80 million acres for National Parks, Forests, Wildlife Refuges and Wild and Scenic Rivers.

The Land Use Planning Commission is seeking ideas on how the 80 million acres should be managed and will develop proposals, from public hearings, for the Secretary of Interior and Congress.

Anyone who has specific recommendations they want communicated to the Commission should plan to testify at the Public Hearings.

Anyone desiring to present

testimony to the Commission may register in person at Alaska Land in the Administration Office or in person at the Chamber of Commerce Log Cabin in Fairbanks, as soon as possible.
