NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES in the REGULATIONS of the COMMERCIAL FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION

Notice is hereby given that the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, under authority vested by AS 16.43.020 and AS 16.43.110, proposes to adopt, amend and repeal regulations in Title 20, Chapter 5 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement and interpret AS 16.05, and AS 16.43, as follows:

- 1) to clarify the point award toward a Kodiak herring permit for a period of military service;
- 2) to require the approval of a parent or guardian in the transfer of an entry permit by a minor;
- 3) to repeal the lease presumption on transfers;
- 4) to prohibit conditional transfers and to invalidate contracts which purport to require transfer or forfeiture of a permit;
- 5) to affirm that a permit transfer between partners is not prohibited; and
- 6) to provide for the transfer of permits by right of survivorship.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.
