The Hoonah Indian Association and the National Park Service signed a Memorandum of Understanding on September 30, 1995 at Hoonah, Alaska at the tradi-

tional potlatch honoring the rais-

ing of the Tribe's first totem pole.

The memorandum recognizes the government-to-government relationship and areas of mutual concern and support, establishes

a framework for cooperative relationships and promotes communication.

This Memorandum of Understanding is a momentous occasion for the Hoonah Indian Association, as it at last recognizes their ties to their Traditional Homeland, Glacier Bay. This Memorandum of Understanding comes about

after years of work by many tribal

members who have since past on as well as dedicated staff at the Glacier Bay National Park and Preserve.

The tribe humbly recognizes our Elders and Ancestors for all of their efforts on behalf of our Tribe.
