1986 Collector Button Design

Every year the excitement and anticipation of the announcement of the new Randy Collector Button Design begins to mount as the festival begins to draw near. This year

we resume the tradition that has prevailed for the past several years by creating a button indicative of Alaska's abundant wildlife. The 1986 collectors button features one of nature's most energetic and industrious animals... the beaver.

Designed by Dan Maninger of Fairbanks, the pin is a result of many years of collecting and/or designing military crests and patches, and other collectible pins.

Though his military family life carried him around the world as a youngster, Dan did graduate from Lathrop High School in Fairbanks in 1966. Since that time he has worked in varying capacities with the Fairbanks School District, and like so many other Alaskans, spent time on the development of the pipeline.

Presently, Dan provides architectural renderings and general drafting capabilities for an architectural firm in Fairbanks. His artistic abilities are always in demand by individuals and organizations desiring a unique and creative button, pin or other promotional piece. The Anchorage Fur Rendezvous is very pleased and proud to have Dan Maninger join our "designer family." His beaver button creation continues the long standing tradition of ingenuity, creativity and appeal that has made our collector buttons so popular over so many years.

Curling: An Honorable Sport

Played on a sheet of ice, beginning with a handshake and good wishes, the Anchorage Curling Club announces openings available for their annual Fur Randy Bonspiel (AKA Tournament). Four person teams (each team must have one each male/female player) and the \$80.00 entry fee are the only requirements for participation in this distinguished indoor event.

Teams will be using a total of sixteen, forty-two-and-one-half-pound "stones" to slide from "point A" to "point B," approximately 110 feet across a narrow strip of ice.

Points are tabulated by teams who glide their stones closest to the center of the target (AKA House). Prizes will be awarded to the top ranked finishing teams!

Tradition brings this 16th Century sport from the frozen lakes and streams of Scotland.

The Territory of Alaska issued a club charter to The Anchorage Curling Club in 1954. Record snowfall in 1958 collapsed the roof on the indoor ice. Sourdoughs may remember watching curling competition in front of the 4th Avenue Federal building and Post Office until 1962, when the Government Hill facility was opened.

Alaskans have always fared well at the national and international competitions with the 1985 Fairbanks Women's Team winning the U.S. Championship and representing Alaska and the U.S. in Sweden.

Spectators are welcome to this years distinguished Bonspiel, still located in the indoor rink of Government Hill. For more info, call 272-2825.
