

Bill aids vessels to remote areas: authorizes 200-mile funds

Vessels taking cargo to remote areas of Alaska could be exempted from certain inapplicable safety requirements if this is the only way to get supplies through, by an amendment added by U. S. Senator Ted Stevens to the Coast Guard Authorization on the Senate floor Wednesday.

Stevens' amendment is designed to alleviate hardship in such areas as Kodiak Island and the Alaska Peninsula which often must rely on obsolete landingcraft for fuel, construction supplies and food.

The Senate also authorized \$100 million for Coast Guard

activities related to enforcement of the 200-mile zone, as requested by U.S. Senators Warren Magnuson and Stevens.

Authorizations were also given for the construction of a Loran C advanced ship and aircraft navigational aid system at Narrow Cape, Alaska, and construction of Coast Guard family housing quarters at Sitka was approved.

These authorizations still require appropriations to be funded.

Under Stevens' cargo vessel amendment, a permit could be granted to a vessel engaged in

transporting cargo, including bulk fuel, within the State of Alaska if: the vessel weighs 300 gross tons or less; it doesn't present an immediate threat to the safety of life or environment; and the vessel was operating in Alaska June 1, 1976, or is a replacement for such a vessel.

This exemption would apply in an emergency situation or in a case where cargo could not reasonably be transported by other means. A permit for this exemption could be issued for a specific trip or for a period of up to one year.

"Alaskans in remote areas have too often suffered a hardship in not being able to get food and fuel just because the only available transport did not come up to inflexible federal standards designed for coastal trade between major cities in the Lower 48. This amendment should

eliminate this intolerable situation," Stevens said.

The bill now goes to a joint Senate-House conference where differences in the two versions of the bill will be reconciled.

Local education laws adopted

Regulations supporting local education were adopted by the State Board of Education at its May meeting. Acting in response to the often voiced concerns of rural Alaskans, the board adopted regulations establishing every child's right to a public education in his local community.

Secondary schools are to be established in all communities which have an elementary school operated by the district or by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The secondary schools should be set up by Sept. 1, 1976, and must be operational by Sept. 1, 1977. Districts may request a further extension of time if construction or major renovation of a facility is necessary before a school may be started.

A local community may request that no secondary school or only a partial secondary school be established, if they

feel that it is in the best interests of their children.

The community's request not to have a secondary school must be through formal action at a public meeting by the local school committee. Review procedures are available to parents of students affected by a community's request not to establish a secondary school in that community.

Also provided for in the regulations is a program planning and evaluation for the new schools.

In other board action, the board approved the promulgation of regulations concerning bilingual education; adopted regulations concerning community schools and authorized the Dept. of Education to continue with its accreditation project.

The next meeting of the board is tentatively scheduled for June 15 and 16 in Juneau.
