COMMERCIAL FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION

Notice is given that the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, under the authority of AS 16.43.100 and .110 (a) proposes to adopt or amend regulations in Title 20, Chapter 05 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement and interpret AS 16.43.100, 210, .240, and .260.

The Commission proposes limiting entry into the Goodness Bay herring gillnet fishery. By regulation the commission proposes to:

- 1. establish the maximum number of permits to be issued in the Goodnews Bay herring gillnet fishery as
- 2. establish that to be eligible to apply for a permanent entry permit for the Goodnews Bay herring gillnet fishery an individual must have participated as an interim-use permit holder during at least one of the four years from 1993 to 1996;
- 3. establish January 1, 1997 as the date for determining an applicant's qualifications for a Goodnews Bay herring gillnet permanent entry permit; and
- establish definitions relating to the proposed limitation of the Goodnews Bay herring gillnet fishery.

The proposed maximum number for the Goodnews Bay herring gillnet fishery represents the highest number of units of gear where legal participation is evi-denced by fish tickets during one of the four years prior to the qualification date. The maximum number finally adopted may be different than those proposed.
