

Hammond-Thomas will run again

A "Skinny Cat Club for Hammond-Thomas" is being formed all over the state to assist in raising money for the re-election effort of Gov. Jay S. Hammond and Lt. Gov. Lowell Thomas.

Linda MacSwain, a 29 year old wife and mother, real estate agent, and a resident of Anchorage, is statewide chairman of the new organization.

Mrs. MacSwain, a life-long resident of Alaska, states that the "Skinny Cat Club" is a small donor program to help Governor Hammond. "We'll raise money from the guy and gal on the street--young and old--the workers, students, retired folks--anybody who wants to help. One dollar to one hundred dollars--and you are a fellow 'skinny cat'," she said.
