The carving of a 22-foot totem pole to help celebrate the Bicentennial, and the beginning of a restoration program for the Russian Mission Building will highlight summer activities Sitka National Historical Park.

The Bicentennial totem pole will honor and celebrate our nation's 200th anniversary by depicting important events of the history of the U.S. from its birth through the space Carbed in a traditional Northwest Coast Indian art style, the totem pole will also offer a symbol of the contribution of Native Americans to the cultural heritage of the nation.

Carving of the pole will take place at the Visitor Center of Sitka National Historical Park where the work can be viewed

by park visitors.

Built in 1842 and occupied continuously until 1969 by the Orthodox Church, the Russian Mission Building in Sitka today, is perhaps the most outstanding is perhaps the most outstanding example of Russian American architecture left in Alaska.

During its lifetime the mission has served as the residence of the Orthodox bishop of Sitka and all Alaska, and as a seminary and training school.
