NOTICE TO ALASKA NATIVE CONTRACTORS SOLICITATION OF NATIVE CONTRACTORS TO PERFORM WORK ON INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS AND/OR PROVIDE CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT SERVICES. The Regional Office of Facilities Engineering and Construction (ROFEC), HEW, wishes to advise you that qualified Indian (Native) Construction Contracting firms which are 100% Indian-owned (Native-owned) will be given preference in award of prime construction contracts for construction at the Alaska Area Native Health Service Hospitals to the extent practicable pursuant to authority under "But Indian Act" (25 U.S. Code Section 471) and "Indian Health Care Improvement Act" (Public Law 94-437). Further, firms which are at least 51% Indian-owned will be given preference in award of subcontracts, consistent with the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (P.L. 93-638).

Anticipated construction for fiscal year 1980: Vent Mechanical Room and Attic of Quarters Building at Bethel; rehab heating system at Kotzebue; rehab heating system at Kanakakan; correct condensation problem in Quarters Building at Tanana; upgrade portions of Electric Priming System at Barrow; rehab boilers and hot water piping at Barrow; repair and replace insulation in cold space at Barrow; provide CSR for Surgery and Delivery at Kanakakan; rehab Quarters Building at Mt. Edgecumbe and a major construction project at Bethel consisting of 40 units of housing to be provided for convalesces construction schedule.

This is notice of your opportunity for pre-qualification to be considered for preferential invitations for prime contract negotiations and/or referral for consideration as subcontractor to potential prime contractors. A list of the qualified Indian firms will be maintained. Updating will be requested by advertisement twice a year. Once on the list, you will be notified and asked for a showing of interest when each construction project is ready for bids or negotiations.

Further, this notice requests a showing of interest of 100% Native-owned firms for consideration for prime contract, or "construction management," contract to provide 40 housing units at Bethel which will require performance within a very compressed schedule. Interested firms with housing experience should immediately request pre-qualification forms from the ROFEC-X office (address above). Consideration will be afforded to those firms submitting a complete pre-qualification form including a certification of Indian ownership to arrive at the office of the contracting officer on or before January 15, 1980.

The Government's decision on the concept of how to provide bid design and construction for this project will be heavily impacted by the responses or lack thereof to this notice.

Please note that this is not an offer of a contract or subcontract, nor is it an invitation for bids.
