

Native American Day proposed

U.S. Sen. Daniel Inouye and 27 other Senators are sponsoring Senate Joint Resolution 184 to designate Jan. 28, 1983 as Native American Day.

Introducing the resolution April 1, Inouye noted that several states "have set aside one day or another to honor American Indians" — a number of them on the fourth Friday

of September.

Inouye said, "There is no national day at present to honor Native Americans." He added that while the resolution sought only the designation of a "day" for 1983, he hoped this might lead to a perpetual designation which would not require annual renewal by the Congress.
