

## Governor's Commission on Administration of Justice meets

The Governor's Commission on the Administration of Justice met in Fairbanks on June 23-24, 1976, to review Action grant applications for funding and to discuss various issues relating to criminal justice system improvement in Alaska.

### Anttonen named

PORTLAND, OREGON—John Anttonen, Superintendent of the North Slope Borough School District, has been elected to the Board of Directors of the Northwest Regional Educational Laboratory (NWREL).

He was elected to a three-year term on the board by representatives of Alaska schools and other agencies in the state which are members of the laboratory.

NWREL Executive Director Lawrence D. Fish said, "We are very pleased that an Alaska educator with Anttonen's far-sightedness and leadership has been elected. We believe he will bring to the board experience and points of view which will be extremely valuable in planning activities to improve education in the sparsely populated areas of Alaska."

The laboratory, a nonprofit organization with administrative offices in Portland, uses new technology and research information to develop projects for improving education and assists schools to use them effectively.

Current activities are aimed at improving instruction in small schools, using new technology in education, providing career education opportunities, and improving bilingual education.

The 52-member institutions in Alaska include the State Dept. of Education, University of Alaska, school districts, professional associations and community groups.

Grants totalling \$173,025 were approved for funding by the Commission for the implementation of the following projects:

—Petersburg Youth Program (Petersburg Council on Alcoholism): \$24,125;

—Youth Services Center (Biddar Corporation-Cordova): \$25,074;

Criminal Justice Liaison for Diversion (Upper Tanana Regional Council on Alcoholism): \$14,950;

—Anchorage Jails Alcoholism Program (Division of Corrections): \$25,200;

Southeast Regional Correctional Institute Substance Abuse Project (Alcoholism Central Agency-Juneau): \$14,300;

—Continuing Judicial Education (Alaska Court System): \$15,120;

—Upgrading Village Ordinances (North Slope Borough): \$9,955;

Conservation Camp for Youth Offenders (Division of Corrections): \$30,881;

—Drug Abuse Training (Alaska Police Standards Council: \$5,000;

—APD Planning and Research (Anchorage Police Department): \$8,430.

The Commission discussed the development of regulations relating to security, privacy, and intelligence formation. A plan for developing these regulations will be presented to the Commission at its next meeting by its staff, the Criminal Justice Planning Agency.

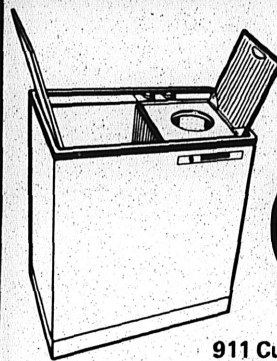

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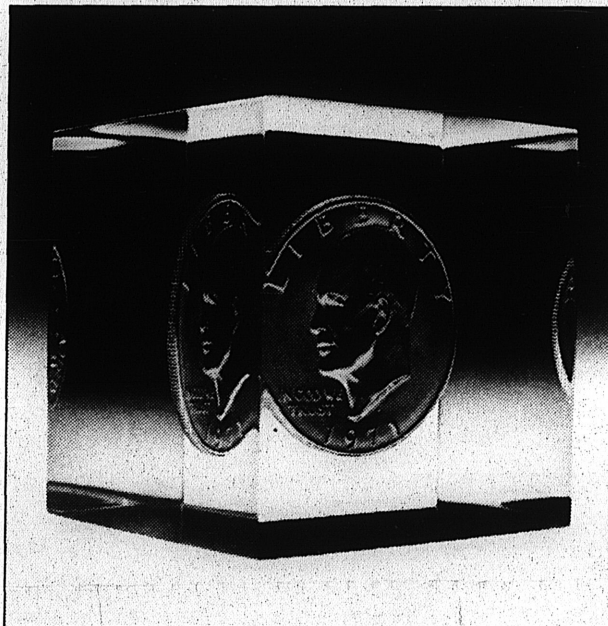
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
