Pursuant to Section 14(c)(3) of the Alaska Native Claims Act (ANCSA), AS stat. 688, AS 44.47.150(a) and 18 AAC 90.015, Chooglung, Limited has offered to convey the surface estate of the following described lands to the State of Alaska, in trust, for any future city that might be established in the Village of Eluk, Alaska.

The surface estate of that certain real property in Surveyed Township 18 South, Range 58 West, Seward Meridian, Bristol Bay Recording District, Third Judicial District, located in the Native village of Eluk, Alaska.

1. Boat Launch and Access Road: A tract of land for a boat launch and access road on an unimproved skidway in Section 1, Containing 1.21 acres more or less.

2. Access Trails and Roads: Six tracts of land for various Eluk roads and trails in Sections 11, 12, and 13. Containing 2.45 acres more or less.

3. Community Expansion Land: Three tracts of land for purpose of future community expansion in Sections 11 and 12. Containing 8.59 acres more or less.

4. Community Well: A one acre tract of land for the Eluk community well.

5. Landfill and Community Expansion Land: A 20 acre tract of land containing a landfill and undeveloped community expansion land.

Aggregating approximately 31.25 acres plus those lands that are to be identified for a future airport and airport access road.

The location of the tracts of land described above are approximate and are subject to re-description upon survey. All judgments or evaluations may be required to conform with the boundaries of any parcels adjacent to or within the land that may be conveyed by Chooglung, Limited under the provisions of Section 14(c)(1), (2) and (4) of ANCSA.

Pursuant to AS 44.47.150(a) and 18 AAC 90.015, the Municipal Land Trust Office, acting on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, has decided to accept the offer in complete satisfaction of the obligation of Chooglung, Limited under Section 14(c)(3) of ANCSA. This decision was reached after consultation with the village of Eluk, Alaska, through

the recognized appropriate village entity, upon weighting the best interests of those residents and any future city that might be established and upon an application of the standards in 18 AAC 90.020.

This notice is being posted and published in accordance with the requirements of 18 AAC 90.015(c) and 910. The decision becomes final upon the expiration of 30 days after the date of its receipt by the village corporation or the recognized village entity, the date of publication, or the date of posting, whichever is latest, unless the decision is appealed to the Commissioner in accordance with 18 AAC 90.040.

Program Announcement COBG-REDI Competitive Grant Program

The Department of Community and Regional Affairs (DCRA) announces the availability of the FY90 Community Development Block Grant - Rural Economic Development Initiative (COBG-REDI) Program Handbook and Application. These publications are available upon request. Please write to, or call, any DCRA Regional Office or the Central Office (465-4800), to request a Handbook and Application.

Schedule: Applications must be received in a DCRA office on or before March 20, 1990. Awards will be announced on or before April 20, 1990.

Eligible Applicants: Only municipalities and organized boroughs under Title 29 of the Alaska Statutes are considered "eligible applicants." Incorporated municipalities may sponsor unincorporated communities or private non-profit organizations by applying as co-applicants. Funding of these grants is subject to DCRA's determination that the incorporated community is compliant to administer such a grant.

Applicants may seek funds to support basic community development and planning projects. Basic applicable federal requirements are the same as in previous years and include citizen participation, mandatory accrual of benefits to those of low and moderate income, environmental review and compliance with Davis Bacon wages.

Only one application will be accepted from each community. The maximum grant award will be \$100,000. However, two or more eligible communities may apply jointly to undertake a single project, in which case the maximum amount available to the project would remain \$100,000 per community.

Requests for funding of for-profit economic development projects must be submitted under the new Rural Development Fund (RDF) program; application materials will be available in February.
