Applications available for individual art fellowships

Six fellowships will be available for the coming academic year.

The Sequoyah provides a one-year, \$1,500 unrestricted stipend paid in two equal installments. Over the past several years, the association has awarded fellowships to American Indians and Alaska Natives pursuing graduate degrees in such diverse fields as education, anthropology, law, social work, public administration, drama and mechanical engineering, at universities throughout the United States.

To be considered for a Sequoyah Fellowship, a graduate student must be an enrolled member of an American Indian tribe or Alaska Native corporation. To apply, the student should immediately provide the association with

a biography describing himself or herself, two letters of recommendation and the name, address and phone number of the financial aid officer at the university the student attends.

The selection will be announced by the association beginning Oct. 1.
