

Land Planners Hold Seminar For 4 Days

The Federal-State Land Use Planning Commission for Alaska held a four-day Land Planning Seminar with support from the Alaska Humanities Forum and the Alaska Department of Community and Regional Affairs.

The seminar began in Anchorage on Monday, September 23, with a tour of the Alaska Resource Library. The main part of the seminar started the next day at Mt. Alyeska Resort.

Participating in the seminar were members of the Land Use Planning Commission, the Resource Planning Team, representatives of the Regional Corporations, municipal representatives, RurAL CAP central and regional staff members as well as representatives from many Federal and State agencies.

The main theme of the seminar was land use planning and the many of the facets of this subject were covered by a host of people experienced in the field.

Panel discussions and individual presentations covered topics from the objectives of land use planning to the mechanics of village land selection.
