20 AAC is amended by adding a new chapter relating to the Alaska Guaranteed Student Loan Program to provide as follows:

(1) Purpose of Guarantee Agency. The state guarantee agency, the Commission on Postsecondary Education, will administer Alaska's participation in the federal Guaranteed Student Loan Program.

(2) Student eligibility. The applicant must meet citizenship requirements. Further eligibility requirements are described.

(3) Educational institution eligibility, responsibilities, limitation, suspension, and termination are detailed through regulation.

(4) Lender responsibilities, suspension, and termination of participation are detailed through regulation.

(5) Repayment procedures. Repayment procedures are detailed through regulation.

(6) Claims administration and collection efforts are described through regulation.

(7) Definitions. This section defines terms used in these regulations.

The Department of Natural Resources, through the Director, Division of Minerals and Energy Management (DMEM), hereby gives notice that applications for approval of the Gwydyr Bay and Milne Point Units have been submitted by the Continental Oil Company (Conoco, Inc.). Comments are hereby requested from interested parties and members of the public on these applications, which provide for combined operation of existing oil and gas leases covering the following lands:

The Department of Natural Resources is a defendant in a pending lawsuit, Village of Kaktovik v. Robert E. LeResche, Civil No. 3AN-78-7331 (filed November 3, 1978). The State of Alaska has taken the position that AS 38.05.305 and AS 38.05.345 do not require notice to the public and an opportunity for public comment regarding state approval of unit designations and unit agreements by state oil and gas leaseholders. However, to accommodate the concerns of the plaintiffs in the lawsuit, notice is being given on the basis that it is permissible for the State to provide this notice and an opportunity for public comment on the Gwydyr Bay and Milne Point Unit agreements. By giving this notice, the State does not waive any legal arguments in support of its stated position.

To the fullest extent permissible, the State intends to limit any possible issues raised by the above-mentioned lawsuit to the lands involved therein. Accordingly, comments are hereby requested from interested parties and members of the public on the Gwydyr Bay and Milne Point Unit agreements which the State proposes to approve as logically subject to exploration and development under the respective unit agreements.

In view of the foregoing, based upon the application of July 13, 1979 for

approval of the Gwydyr Bay and Milne Point Units, and review of supporting geologic and engineering data and other materials, the Director, Division of Minerals and Energy Management, proposes to recommend approval of the Gwydyr Bay and Milne Point Units. In support of this proposed action, the Director has prepared a preliminary decision and findings.

The Director concludes therein that the Gwydyr Bay and Milne Point Units are in the public interest, will result in exploration and development under unit plans without regard to lease boundaries and diverse ownership, enable coordination of development activities, avoid unnecessary duplication of facilities, centralize environmental control, have minimal impact on traditional uses of land, conserve oil and gas resources, protect the correlative rights of all parties having interest in oil and gas resources in land covered by or adjacent to the unit, and protect the interests of all affected parties and the state as lessor and royalty owner. The Director finds that the proposed action will not limit or diminish access to public or navigable waters beyond any limitations (if any) already contained in the oil and gas leases covered by each unit agreement.

Copies of the applications, the unit agreements and the preliminary decision and findings prepared by the Director, DMEM, are available for public inspection at the offices of the Division of Minerals and Energy Management, 703 W. Northern Lights Blvd., Anchorage, Alaska. Copies of these documents will be available at cost.

Persons wishing to submit written comments concerning this unit agreement, and the Department's proposed action, must submit their comments to the Director on or before August 30, 1979. Under this notice, the state will review and consider all written comments and apply the standard of review mandated by the Administrative Procedure Act.

Following consideration of all submitted comments, the Director of the Division of Minerals and Energy Management will forward his recommendations to the Commissioner, Department of Natural Resources, concerning approval of the two unit agreements. The Commissioner, Department of Natural Resources, will take action upon these recommendations by September 26, 1979.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES  
IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE  
DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL  
RESOURCES GOVERNING OIL  
AND GAS LEASING

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Natural Resources, under authority vested by AS 38.05.020, proposes to adopt, amend and repeal regulations in Title 11 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement the oil and gas leasing statute, AS 38.05.180, as amended during the 1978 legislative session.

Changes are proposed in Chapter 83 of Title 11 of the Alaska Administrative Code. Article 2 of that chapter is proposed to be repealed, and to be replaced with regulations for net profit share leasing. A new Article 7 dealing with minimum work commitments and a new Article 8 dealing with exploration incentive credits are proposed to be added to the chapter. These three articles were the subject of a public hearing held by the department on May 23, 1979, in Anchorage, and have been revised subsequent to that hearing.

The net profit share leasing regulations have been expanded to more clearly define the allowable costs and deductions under a net profit share lease. The work commitment regulations have been revised to allow the commissioner to determine the criteria upon which a work commitment would be applied, and are being noticed at this time to solicit further comment. The exploration incentive credit regulations are being noticed at this time in order to solicit further comment.

The department is also proposing to adopt new regulations providing for royalty bidding and for a sliding scale royalty. The royalty bidding regulation is a new section 182 in Chapter 83, and provides for a method of bidding on oil and gas leases in which the royalty share reserved to the state is the bid variable. The sliding scale royalty regulation is a new section 183 in Chapter 83, and provides for a royalty reserved to the state based on a sliding scale formula to be established by the commissioner based upon volume of production or any other factor."
