

Olympics highlights shown on television

"Highlights of the 1979 World Eskimo-Indian Olympics" a thirty minute special saluting the winning athletes and queen of this year's Olympics held at the University of Alaska Patty Gym in Fairbanks, July 26-28, is scheduled to air on the state satellite system Friday, August 17 from 7-7:30 p.m.

The special, sponsored by the North Slope Borough, which sent the largest delegation to the Olympics and SOHIO, features play by play commentary by Mitch Demienteff, Sports Editor of the TUNDRA TIMES, and interviews with the Two Foot high kick winner Richard Jones, Jr. who represents CINA, Knuckle Hop winner Homer

Lord of Fairbanks, Ear Pull champion Billy Ahalik from Barrow and the new 1979 World Eskimo-Indian Olympics Queen Marilyn Milsaruk who represented the Arctic Native Brotherhood.
