IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE
DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL
RESOURCES

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Natural Resources, under authority vested by AS 38.05.020, AS 41.17.020, and AS 41.17.080, proposes to adopt, amend, and repeal regulations in Title II of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement AS 16.20.030, AS 38.05.115, AS 38.05.330, AS 38.05.080, AS 41.15, AS 41.17, and AS 45.15.315, as follows:

A new chapter, 11 AAC 65, Land Use Permits, is adopted to set the application procedure and terms of a general non-refundable permit to use the surface of state-owned land for transportation, temporary buildings, storage, trapping cabins, existing shelters in state game refuges, grazing livestock, and similar uses. This chapter repeals several other limited-purpose permits the department has used in the past, and the regulations on those limited-purpose permits are repealed: 11 AAC 58.200-210, 11 AAC 62.720-790, 11 AAC 62.820-830, 11 AAC 76.540, 11 AAC 86.600, 11 AAC 94, and 11 AAC 96.

11 AAC 76, Timber and Material Sales, is repealed, and a new chapter, 11 AAC 71 is adopted to replace it. It covers the procedures and contract stipulations for the negotiated or competitive sale of state-owned materials (gravel, stone, etc.) and timber, including abandoned or unbranded logs found in state waters or tidelands. It specifies bid deposits, contract provisions, appraisal and re-appraisal, performance bonding, and operating requirements, and sets out criteria for the decision whether to require primary processing of logs in Alaska before they are exported.

A new chapter, 11 AAC 95, Forest Resources and Practices, is adopted. It applies to all forested land, including land owned by municipalities and private citizens. Article 1, Forest Practices, implements AS 41.17. It sets standards for logging to meet or protect water quality, reduce fire and flood danger, control insect infestations and tree diseases, and help ensure reforestation. Except on state land, operators must notify the department beginning logging, and all operations are subject to inspection.

Article 2, Forest Fire Protection, incorporates regulations on burning permits and fire season closures currently in effect as 11 AAC 92. It also requires that all operators in or near forests be required to equip their machinery to lessen fire danger, post a watchman, and have fire-fighting tools available for their crews.

Article 3, Log Brands, sets the procedure for registering a log brand, which is required before rafting or towing logs in state waters.

Article 4 covers definitions for the chapter.

IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE
DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL
RESOURCES GOVERNING
UNITIZATION OF OIL AND GAS
LEASES

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Natural Resources, under authority vested by AS 38.05.020, proposes to adopt, amend and repeal regulations in Title II of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement the oil and gas leasing statute, AS 38.05.180, with respect

to unitization of oil and gas leases. The proposed changes clarify and amend the procedures, terms and criteria to be used by the Commissioner of Natural Resources in approving unitization of oil and gas leases. The proposed regulations authorize creation of units for the purposes of conserving the natural resources of oil or a part of an oil or gas reservoir, field or like area, maximizing recovery of hydrocarbons, preventing physical and economic waste, protecting correlative rights and providing for efficient exploration and development of unitized leases.

The proposed regulations specify the requirements for unit plans of Operations and Plans of Development, which must be approved by the Director, Division of Minerals and Energy Management, before lessees can proceed with exploration and development in the unit area.

The proposed regulations also provide that a unit will terminate five years after approval unless a well capable of producing hydrocarbons in commercial quantities has been drilled prior to that date. The commissioner may approve a single extension of the unit term of not more than five years.

Substantive changes are proposed as follows:

(1) 11 AAC 83.300, Application for Designation of Area, is repealed.
(2) A new section 11 AAC 83.301 is proposed which sets out the purposes for unitization.

(3) 11 AAC 83.305, Designation; Effect, is repealed.

(4) A new section 11 AAC 83.306 is proposed which sets out the process of application for preliminary approval of a unit area.

(5) 11 AAC 83.310, Draft of Agreement, is repealed.

(6) A new section 11 AAC 83.311 is proposed which sets out the process of application for final unit approval.

(7) A new section 11 AAC 83.318 is proposed which requires that unit agreements be executed on a standard Alaska unit agreement form.

(8) 11 AAC 83.320, Parties, is amended by authorizing the commissioner to change the terms of leases committed to a unit with the consent of the unit area.

(10) A new section 11 AAC 83.341 is proposed which requires the commissioner to contract or expand the unit area to the minimum area required to include one or more reservoirs or potential hydrocarbon accumulations.

(11) A new section 11 AAC 83.343 is proposed which sets out requirements for the Unit Operating Agreement.

(12) 11 AAC 83.350, Approval of Federal Units, is amended to authorize the commissioner to enter into agreements with the federal government providing for unitization of state and federal leases.

(13) 11 AAC 83.355, Applications, is amended slightly for conformity with other changes proposed in this article.

(14) 11 AAC 83.370, Segregated Units, is amended to require segregation of a lease when part of it is included in a unit.

(15) A new section 11 AAC 83.375 is proposed which sets out requirements for gaining approval of a Plan of Operations.

(16) A new section 11 AAC 83.380 is proposed which sets out requirements for gaining approval of a Plan of Development.

(17) A new section 11 AAC 83.383 is proposed which authorizes establishment of participating areas within a unit.

(18) A new section 11 AAC 83.385, Extension of Leases by Commitment to an Approved Unit is proposed as a slightly amended version of 11 AAC 83.190. 11 AAC 83.190 is repealed.

(19) A new section 11 AAC 83.390 is proposed which specifies that a unit agreement terminates five years after approval unless a well capable of producing hydrocarbons in commercial quantities has been drilled prior to that date. The commissioner may approve a single extension of the unit term of not more than five years.

(20) A new section 11 AAC 83.395 is proposed which defines the terms used in this article.
