## Program lines established for seismic exploration on the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge

On September 15, 1983, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife service (FWS) approved, with modifications, an exploration plan for seismic study on the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge coastal plain. That exploration plan, which was submitted by Geophysical Service, Incorporated (GSI), was modified by the FWS to specify a six-by-twelve mile seismic grid instead of the two-by-two mile grid proposed by GSI. This means that seismic study lines oriented in a north-south direction will be six miles apart and lines oriented in an east-west direction will be twelve miles apart. Through consultation between the FWS and GSI, the locations of these seismic lines have been established. A map showing the locations of these lines is available from: Regional Director, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, 1011 E. Exploration activities under this approved plan are expected to begin early in January 1984.
