Pursuant to Section 14(c)(3) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, (ANCSA), 85 Stat. 688, AS 44.47.150(a) and 19 AAC 90.015 of the Municipal Trust Land Regulations, Paug-vik Incorporated, Limited has offered to convey the surface estate of the hereinafter described lands to the State of Alaska, in trust, for any municipal corporation hereinafter established in the Village of Naknek, Alaska:

The surface estate of that certain real property located in Surveyed Township 16 South, Range 46 West, Seward Meridian, Alaska, being situated at the Native village of Naknek, Alaska, more particularly described as follows:

Adjustments or exclusions may be required to conform with the boundaries of any parcels adjacent to or within the land that may be conveyed by Paug-vik Incorporated, Limited under the provisions of Section 14(c)(1) and (2) of ANCSA Pursuant to AS 44.47.150(a) and 19 AAC 90.015, the Municipal Land Trust Officer, acting on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, has decided to accept the above referenced offer in partial fulfillment of the obligation of Paug-vik Incorporated, Limited under Section 14(c)(3) of ANCSA. This decision was reached after consultation with the village of Naknek, Alaska, through a meeting of village residents; upon weighing the best interests of those residents and any municipal corporation which may be

hereinafter established in Naknek and upon an application of the standards in 19 AAC 90.020.

On December 6, 1983, the residents of Naknek assembled in a village meeting adopted a resolution requesting the Commissioner of the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, acting as trustee for the future municipality of Naknek, Alaska, in accordance with AS 44.47.150(b) to grant a lease for the parcel described above to the Bristol Bay Borough for the construction and operation of a sanitary landfill. This ac-

tion is deemed to be consistent with the standards for disposal outlined in 19 AAC 90.410-.490.

Therefore, in accordance with 19 AAC 90.430 and .440, the Commissioner approves the disposal of a leasehold interest to the Bristol Bay Borough for the operation of a sanitary landfill. The term of the lease is 40 (forty) years.

This notice is being posted and published in accordance with the requirements of 19 AAC 90.015(3), .420 and .910. The decision becomes final

NOTICE OF UTILITY TARIFF FILING

The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby gives notice that ALASCOM, INC. (Alascom) a telephone utility, has filed a tariff revision (TA229-98) which is a proposal to make numerous changes in the Message Telephone Service section of Alascom's intrastate tariff. These revisions are briefly described below.

1. Alascom proposes to revise the regulations for Reversed Charge Billing Arrangements (Zenith Service). Alascom states that the proposed revisions for this service amplifies the existing regulations and that the basic service provided remains unchanged.

Alascom further states that the Fairbanks Toll Center was re-centered into the Anchorage Toll Center. Thus, Alascom proposes to delete reference to the Fairbanks Toll Center for the Reversed Charge Billing Arrangements. According to Alascom, the reduction of the number of toll centers from three to two will result in a \$5.50 per month reduction for those customers designating all three of the previous rate centers.

2. Alascom proposes to delete certain definitions, for example, Maritime Mobile Service — Class III-B and Remote Area Switching. Alascom also proposes to add numerous definitions such as Bill to Third Party, Data or Facsimile Transmitting or Receiving Equipment, DIAL-IT Service, Private Direct Toll Access Line Service and Rural Radio Telephone Service. Alascom states that these definitions are proposed due to the addition of new services and the need for more definitive descriptions of the various tariff references.

3. Alascom proposes to withdraw Rural Radio Telephone service in the villages of Akiachak, Akiak, Atmautluak, Napaskiak, Nunapitchuk, Tuluksak, Tuntutuliak and Nikolaevsk. Alascom states that the majority of locations in which this service has been provided is now served by either earth stations or microwaves.

4. Alascom proposes to withdraw the regulations and rates for the Remote Area Switching Service. Alascom states that there are presently no subscribers and all the former customers are presently being served by local exchange services.

In addition to the above provisions Alascom proposes a separate Person to Person tariff regulation section and to make minor textual corrections to its tariff.

If after investigation the Commission finds a rate or classification different from that proposed by Alascom is reasonable, the Commission may approve a rate or classification which varies from that proposed.

As required by the Alaska Administrative Code, any statement filed with the Commission should clearly affirm that the interested person has filed a true copy of the statement with Alascom.
