Pursuant to 19 AAC 90.140(c) and .910, notice is hereby given that the undersigned has found the "Petition for Recognition" submitted by the Pitka's Point Traditional Council to be acceptable under applicable sections of the Municipal Trust Land Regulations. No adverse written comments were received nor were other petitions filed pursuant to Notices for Publication dated November 12 and 25, 1981, and Notice of Posting dated December 28, 1981. The undersigned hereby states her intent to recognize the Pitka's Point traditional Council as the appropriate village entity, under AS 44.47.150 and 19 AAC 90.010 et seq., to represent the residents of Pitka's Point in decisions affecting municipal trust land administered by the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, State of Alaska. This recognition will take effect, without further notice, 30 days following the date this notice is posted or 30 days following the last date of publication, whichever is later, unless adverse written comments are received within that period, and will remain in effect thereafter unless and until rescinded in accordance with 19 AAC 90.150.

LAND DISPOSALS

Notice Pursuant to AS 38.05.345

Take notice that the State of Alaska, as part of an ongoing land disposal program, is offering approximately 67,360 acres as potential remote parcel sites and 22,254 acres of subdivision land statewide to the general public.

Pursuant to 11 AAC 55.250(b) and AS 38.05.345, notice is also hereby given that the Alaska Division of Land and Water Management is proposing to classify/reclassify all lands referred to in this legal notice not previously classified as either private recreation or residential land. This action is being proposed for the purpose of facilitating the disposal of these lands under the State Land Disposal Program.

Effective July 27, 1981, the land disposal programs were significantly changed by Chapter 113, SLA 1981. Some changes have been noted in this legal notice under the individual programs. More detailed information regarding these changes will be found in the land sale brochure.

REMOTE PARCEL PROGRAM  
State lands in the following areas will be available for entry and lease under the provisions of AS 38.05.077:

Zitziana: Located approximately 40 miles northeast of Lake Minchumina on the east shore of the Zitziana River. The number of entry authorizations

in Zitziana will be limited to 68 and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Cannon: Located approximately 40 miles west of Anderson on the Kantishna River and adjacent to east Twin Lake. The number of entry authorizations in Cannon will be limited to 55 and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Tok Hills: Located approximately 10 miles northeast of Tok Junction and north of the Tanana River. The number of entry authorizations in Tok Hills will be limited to 90 and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Cathedral Bluffs: Located approximately 10 miles west of Tok Junction and north of the Tanana River. The number of entry authorizations in Cathedral Bluffs will be limited to 55 and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Rock Creek: Located approximately 50 miles south of Nenana and west of the Parks Highway on Stampede Trail. The number of entry authorizations in Rock Creek will be limited to 13 and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Northeast Alaska Range - Wood River: Located approximately 30 miles southeast of Fairbanks east side of Wood River. The number of entry authorizations in the Northeast Alaska Range will be limited to 23 and the maximum parcel size will be 20 acres.

Gold King: Located approximately 40 miles southeast of Fairbanks in the Japan Hills. The number of entry authorizations in Gold King will be limited to 23 and the maximum parcel size will be 20 acres.

Chena South: Located approximately 30 miles northeast of Fairbanks on the south side of the Chena River at Mile 25 on the Chena Hot Springs Road. Chena South will be open for unlimited entry and the maximum parcel size will be 20 acres.

Ninemile: Located approximately 108 road miles northwest of Anchorage, 10 miles south of Mile 3 of the Petersville and approximately 3 miles west of the Parks Highway. The number of entry authorizations in Ninemile will be limited to 30 and the maximum parcel size will be 20 acres.

Amber Lakes: Located approximately 9 miles southwest of Talkeetna and 10 miles south of the Petersville Road just off Oilwell Road. The number of entry authorizations in Amber Lakes will be limited to 40 and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Big Eleven: Located west of the Sustina River approximately 25 miles northwest of Willow. Big Eleven will be open for unlimited entry and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Big River: Located approximately 30 miles southwest of Farewell and 64 miles southeast of McGrath. Big River will be open for unlimited entry and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Friday Creek: Located south of the Hayes River approximately 75 miles northwest of Anchorage and 22 miles southwest of Skwentna. Friday Creek will be open for unlimited entry and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Hewitt-Whiskey Lake II: Located west of the Sustina River approximately 70 miles northwest of Anchorage, between the Yentna River and Shell Lake. Hewitt-Whiskey Lake II will be open for unlimited entry and the maximum parcel size will be 5 acres.

Johnson Creek: Located north of the Skwentna River approximately 14 miles west of Skwentna and 80 miles northwest of Anchorage. Johnson Creek will be open for unlimited entry and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Kichatna: Located approximately 85 air miles northwest of Anchorage between the Kichatna River and west of the Yenlo Hills. Nakochna will be open for unlimited entry and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Windy Fork: Located approximately 100 miles southeast of McGrath and is situated along the Windy Fork River, 5 miles west of the Farewell landing strip. Windy Fork will be open for unlimited entry and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Yenlo Hills: Located approximately 85 air miles northwest of Anchorage between the Kichatna River and Mt. Yenlo. Yenlo Hills will be open for unlimited entry and the maximum parcel size will be 40 acres.

Under the Remote Parcel Program, the State will make large tracts of remote land available to individuals who: (1) are at least 18 years of age at the time of application, (2) have been a resident of the State for not less than one year immediately preceding the date the application is submitted, (3) have not received a remote parcel lease from the State within eight

years immediately preceding the date of staking the remote parcel, and (4) are not currently holding a valid entry authorization for a Remote Parcel Selection Area for which the staking period is still open.

The areas listed above have been designated as Remote Parcel Selection Areas and will be open for staking on dates which will be listed in the brochure. Parcel selection procedures packets for each of the areas will be available by the first day of the staking period at the District Office which has jurisdiction over the lands. Some of the Remote Parcel Selection Areas will be limited in the number of entries allowed. Applications for entry authorizations in limited Remote Parcel Selection Areas must be filed during the lottery filing period. If more applications are filed for a selection area than the number of entry authorizations allowed, a chance drawing will be held to award the initial entry authorizations.

After an individual has properly and personally staked a parcel of land, he may apply to lease it for a period of five years with an option to renew the lease for another five years. Applications will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. The annual rental is /acre per year. To become eligible to purchase a remote parcel, the lessee must have it surveyed at his own expense. The purchase price will be the appraised value as of the date the lease is accepted by the Director or his designee. The terms of the purchase of the remote parcel are the same as those for lands sold by lottery.

State land in the following areas will be available for sale under the provisions of AS 38.05.057: Desperation: Located approximately 20 miles northwest of Fairbanks, north of old Murphy Dome Road, 55 parcels ranging in size from 3 to 5 acres.

Eagle: Located 8 miles northwest of Tok Junction on the Alaska Highway, 109 parcels ranging in size from 3 to 5 acres.

Haystack: Located 24 miles north of Fairbanks on the south slope of Haystack Mountain, 111 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 10 acres.

Haystack Extension: Located 25 miles north of Fairbanks on upper slopes of Haystack Mountain, 105 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 5 acres.

Lake Minchumina II: Located northwest of Lake Minchumina and 4 miles northeast of the Minchumina airstrip, 40 parcels ranging in size from 3 to 5 acres.

Olnes West: Located 20 miles north of Fairbanks at Mile 8 of the Elliott Highway, 21 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 12 acres.

Sam Creek: Located 3 miles northwest of Dot Lake on the Alaska Highway and 50 miles northwest of Tok Junction, 91 parcels ranging in size from 2 to 12 acres.

Buffalo Ag: Located 10 miles east of Delta Junction and south of Clearwater Campground, 3 parcels ranging in size from 80 to 280 acres.

Eielson Ag: Located 25 miles southeast of Fairbanks, between Pile Driver Slough and the Tanana River, due west of Eielson AFB, 14 parcels ranging in size from 120 to 640 acres.

Alder View: The proposed subdivision is located north of the Yentna River approximately 40 miles southwest of Talkeetna, and 64 miles northwest of Anchorage, 109 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 5 acres.

Bald Mountain: The proposed subdivision is located approximately 12 miles southeast of Talkeetna and 38 miles northeast of Willow, 218 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 5 acres.

Kahlitna Flats: The proposed subdivision is located west of Kroto Creek approximately 50 miles northwest of Anchorage and 16 miles northwest of Willow, 274 parcels ranging in size from 5 to 15 acres.

Kutna Creek: Located approximately 50 miles northwest of Anchorage and 6 miles east of Alexander Lake, 60 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 5 acres.

Kenney Lake: The proposed subdivision is located along the Edgerton Highway about 5 miles east of its intersection with the Richardson Highway and approximately 32 miles southeast of Glennallen, 56 parcels ranging in size from 2 to 5 acres.

Lockwood Lake: The proposed subdivision is located east of Lockwood Lake approximately 46 miles northwest of Anchorage and 20 miles west of Willow, 26 parcels ranging in size from 5 to 15 acres.

Ninemile Creek: The proposed subdivision is located south of Petersville Road near Sawmill Lake approximately 8 miles west of Talkeetna and 40 miles northwest of Willow, 75 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 5 acres.

Onestone Lake: The proposed subdivision is located between Onestone Lake and Shell Lake approximately 65 miles northwest of Anchorage and 12 miles west of Skwentna, 139 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 5 parcels.

Saddle Point: The proposed subdivision is located approximately 2 miles southwest of Cordova and is situated west of Whitshed Road, 10 parcels ranging in size from 3 to 4.5 acres.

Safari Lake: The proposed subdivision is located near Safari Lake in the Petersville area approximately 17 miles northwest of Talkeetna and 52 miles northwest of Willow, 69 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 15 acres.

Shell Hills: The proposed subdivision is located between Onestone Lake and the Skwentna River approximately 65 miles northwest of Anchorage and 12 miles west of Skwentna. It encompasses approximately 850 acres, 173 parcels ranging in size from 3.9 to 5 acres.

Shell Lake North: The proposed subdivision is located along the north shore of Shell Lake approximately 65 miles northwest of Anchorage and 12 miles west of Skwentna. It encompasses approximately 416 acres, 102 parcels ranging in size from 3 to 5 acres.

South Caribou Lake Addition: The proposed subdivision is located approximately 24 miles south of Caribou Lake. It encompasses approximately 200 acres, 40 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 5 acres.

Talkeetna Bluffs Addition: The proposed subdivision is south of the Talkeetna River and is located approximately 8 miles east of Talkeetna. It encompasses approximately 295 acres, 59 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 5 acres.

Trail Ridge: The proposed subdivision is located west of the Sustina River and is approximately 34 miles northwest of Anchorage and 30 miles west of Big Lake. It encompasses approximately 1,000 acres, 62 parcels ranging in size from 16 to 35 acres.

Chase II: Located 66 miles north of Anchorage on the shore of the Talkeetna River, 3 to 9 miles east of Talkeetna, 195 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 15 acres.

Fireweed Mountain: Located approximately 8 miles southwest of McCarthy, 50 miles east of Chitina and about one-half mile north of the Nizina River, 39 parcels ranging in size from 3 to 5 acres.

South Caribou Lake: Located approximately 16 miles northeast of Homer, 12 parcels ranging in size from 4.5 to 5 acres.

Greenward: Located 6 miles northwest of Wasilla on the Pittman-Schrock Road, 7 parcels ranging in size from 1 to 2 acres.

Goldfreak: Located approximately on Mile 12 of the south Big Lake Road, 13 parcels ranging in size from 1.2 to 1.9 acres.

Bruce Lake: Located 4 miles northwest of Wasilla and less than one-half mile east of Kalm-buck Lake, 27 parcels ranging in size from 1.2 to 3.6 acres.

Offer Lakes: Located 34 miles northwest of Anchorage and 4 miles northwest of Sustina Station, 37 parcels ranging in size from 4 to 5 acres.

Swan Lake: Located approximately 100 miles north of Anchorage, 15 miles northwest of Talkeetna, and 2 miles west side of the Parks Highway, 41 parcels ranging in size from 3 to 5 acres.

Trapper Creek: Located 84 miles northeast of Anchorage, 8 miles west of Talkeetna and 2

miles west of the Parks Highway, 66 parcels ranging in size from 2.6 to 5 acres.

Talkeetna Bluffs: Located approximately 7 miles northeast of Talkeetna on the south bank of the Talkeetna River, 7 parcels ranging in size from 3.3 to 5 acres.

Bartlett Hills: Located 8 to 12 miles southeast of Talkeetna and 5 miles east of the Sunshine Highway. Four tracts containing a total of 145 parcels ranging in size from 3 to 5 acres.

Thorne Bay: 108 parcels, ranging in size from 2 to 5 acres, located on the east side of Prince of Wales Island, approximately 45 miles northwest of downtown Ketchikan.

Mud Bight: 64 parcels, ranging in size from .5 to .8 acres, located on Revillagigedo Island approximately 6 miles northwest of Ketchikan.

Edna Bay: 119 parcels, ranging in size from 2 to 5 acres, located on the south tip of Kosciusko Island, approximately 85 miles northwest of Ketchikan and 60 miles southwest of Petersburg.

To qualify for participation, the applicant shall certify that at the time of the application: (1) he is 18 years old, (2) he has been a resident of the State for not less than one year immediately preceding the date of application, and (3) he has not purchased land at a sale by lottery in the State within the eight years immediately preceding the sale date.

The successful application on each parcel will be determined by lottery under the provisions of AS 38.05.057.

Terms of Sale:  
A successful applicant for a subdivision parcel shall purchase the land at its appraised fair market value with 5% down and the remaining balance to be paid in quarterly or annual payments over a period of not more than 20 years, with interest compounded annually on a level payment basis at the prevailing Federal Land Bank interest rate in effect at the time the contract is signed by the Director. The 5% down payment shall be made at the lottery. Personal checks, cash, certified checks, or money orders are acceptable.

Discounts:  
The Land Discount Program will be in effect on all of the subdivision parcels included in this offering. A discount will be offered to a maximum of 50% of the purchase price or \$25,000, whichever is less, for non-veteran residents and 75% of the purchase price of \$37,500, whichever is less, for qualified veteran residents based on years of Alaska residency and other requirements. The land discount is not available for homesite parcels.
