## Successful

A RurAL CAP program which supplies hot breakfasts to school children in the Dillingham area has met with such success that it is hoped a plan will be formulated to have it continued for the 1972-73 term. At the present time, breakfasts are scheduled to end in June, 1972.

The agency has been operating the program in ten villages near Dillingham, using U.S. Department of Agriculture surplus foods under the Emergency Food and Medical Program.

Peter Kunnuk, Program Specialist for RurAL CAP, discussed the program with Ron Klemm, Area Superintendent for Alaska State-Operated Schools.

Klemm is interested in seeing the program continued and indicated that he would be in support of the state taking the program for the next school year.

Teachers have reported there is a noticeable improvement in the students' health and physical appearance, as well as in their attention span.

The program also sponsors a nutritionist who travels to the villages and at present is conducting classes for food preservation by canning.
