NORTH SLOPE BOROUGH NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION FILE NUMBER GA-06-74

1. Date of Election: April 30, 1974

2. The time of opening and closing of the polling places: The polling places shall be open between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M.

3. The location of precincts, polling places and a description of the voting precincts by boundary.

ANAKTUVUK PASS PRECINCT. Beginning at the peak of Soakpak Mt.; thence southerly to the peak of Kollutuk Mt.; thence easterly to the peak of Three River Mt.; thence northerly to the peak of Mt. Stuver; thence westerly to the peak of Soakpak Mt.; the point of beginning. Polling Place: State School

BARROW PRECINCT. Beginning at 150 west longitude and the boundary of the State of Alaska in the Arctic Ocean; thence southerly along 150 west longitude to its point of intersection with 68 north latitude; thence westerly along 68 north latitude to its point of intersection with a north-south line drawn through Point Franklin on the west; thence northerly along a north-south line drawn through Point Franklin on the west; to the boundary of the State of Alaska in the Arctic Ocean; thence easterly along the boundary of the State of Alaska to 150 west longitude; the point of beginning excluding Browerville and Anaktuvuk Pass Precincts. Polling Place: Youth Center.

BARTER ISLAND PRECINCT. That area beginning at a point on the International Boundary between Alaska and the Dominion of Canada and the intersection of the boundary of the proposed North Slope Borough; thence northerly along the boundary common to the State of Alaska and Canada to the northernmost boundary of the State of Alaska; thence meandering westerly to its intersection with 150 west longitude; thence southerly along 150 west longitude to its intersection with 68 north latitude; thence easterly along 68 north latitude to its intersection with 146 west longitude; thence northerly along the 146 west longitude line to its intersection with 68 30' north latitude line to the easterly boundary of the State of Alaska on the International Boundary; the point of beginning. Polling Place: BIA School

BROWERVILLE PRECINCT. Beginning where the outlet of Tasigaroog Lagoon empties into the Arctic Ocean, thence upstream in the center of said outlet to Tasigaroog Lagoon; then along the south side of said lagoon and the southerly side of Isatkoak Lagoon to the most southerly point; thence due east to Elson Lagoon. This precinct includes Doctor Island, Deadmans Island, the Dew Line Installation, Arctic Research Laboratory, and the Pacific Architects and Engineers Incorporated site. Polling Site: Mukluk Shop

POINT HOPE PRECINCT. All of that area draining into the Arctic Ocean from Cape Thompson to Cape Lisburne, including the military site. Polling Place: Tigara Hall

WAINWRIGHT PRECINCT. All of that area draining into Arctic Ocean from Cape Lisburne on the west to a north-south line drawn through Pt. Franklin on the east. Polling Place: National Guard Armory

4. The qualifications of voters: A person may vote who:

1. is a citizen of the United States, qualified to vote in the State elections.

2. has been a resident of the North Slope Borough for 30 days immediately preceding the date of the election.

3. is registered to vote in the State elections.

4. is not disqualified under Article V of the Constitution of the State of Alaska.

5. The type of election, general or special: The election is a special election.

6. The propositions submitted to the elector are:

(a) Shall the proposed New Home Rule Charter for the North Slope Borough prepared by the Charter Commission and date February 28, 1974, be adopted:

(b) Shall the following powers be transferred from existing municipalities within the North Slope Borough and be acquired and exercised as areawide powers by the North Slope Borough; separate vote shall be made on each of the following powers:

(1) Streets and sidewalks
(2) Sewers and sewage treatment
(3) Watercourse and flood control facilities

(4) Health Services and hospital facilities
(5) Telephone systems
(6) Light, power and heating utilities

(7) Water
(8) Transportation systems
(9) Libraries

(10) Airport and aviation facilities
(11) Garbage and solid waste collection and disposal services and facilities

(12) Housing and urban renewal rehabilitation and development
(13) Preservation, maintenance and protection of historic sites, buildings and monuments.

(c) Election of two (2) assemblymen as provided in Section 17.020(b) of the proposed Home Rule Charter for the North Slope Borough.

INVITATION FOR BIDS STATE OF ALASKA

DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS

Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials and equipment, and performing all work on Project RS-0559(2), Birchwood Loop described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, May 2, 1974 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of grading, drainage, and asphalt surfacing on 4.5 miles of the Birchwood Loop Road near Anchorage, Alaska.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 70,000 tons of borrow; 68,000 tons of subbase B; 4,400 linear feet of 18" pipe conduit; 623 square feet of standard signs; 7,300 tons of asphalt surfacing; and miscellaneous items of work. Asphalt surfacing will be bid as alternative items utilizing Hot Asphalt Pavement and Emulsified Asphalt Surface Mix. 150 tons of AR-10 and CSS-1 respectively will be needed in the surfacing mixtures.

All work shall be completed in 160 Calendar days.

Plans and specifications may be obtained by all who have a bona fide need for them for bidding purposes from the Chief Design Engineer, P.O. Box 1467, Juneau, Alaska 99801 at a charge of \$10.00 for each assembly. Plans may be examined at Department of Highway Offices in Anchorage, Fairbanks, Valdez.
