

Duties and Responsibilities:

- (11) Experience in distance delivery of courses and programs.

- (2) Extensive knowledge of the geographic, climatic, and political conditions of the North Slope of Alaska, or other Arctic areas;
- (3) Experience in Native American, multi-cultural, or bi-cultural situations.

**NOTICE OF PROPOSED REGULATIONS
OF THE
DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL
SERVICES**

Notice is given that the Alaska Department of Health and Social Services, under authority vested by AS 18.05.040 and AS 47.05.010, proposes to adopt regulations in Title 7 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with the Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants, and Children, to implement AS 18.05.020.

Title 7 of the Alaska Administrative Code is proposed to be amended by adding a new Chapter 24 as follows:

Chapter 24 of Title 7 of the Alaska Administrative Code will contain regulations which implement the Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC). The regulations will describe the applicability of the chapter and the areas and populations to be served by the program. The regulations will adopt the federal WIC program regulations in 7 CFR part 246. The regulations in Chapter 24 will supplement the federal regulations. The regulations will describe eligibility criteria, program benefits, and program requirements for participants. The regulations will also describe the rights and responsibilities for local agencies and vendors that participate in the delivery systems set up to distribute supplemental food under the WIC program.

NOTICE OF UTILITY TARIFF FILING

The Alaska Public Utilities Commission hereby gives notice of its consideration of a tariff revision (TA250-98) filed by ALASCO, Inc. (Alascom), proposing to offer for sale the customer premises equipment (CPE) acquired by Alascom prior to January 1, 1983.

Alascom proposes to make the CPE available for purchase effective January 1, 1989 for a two year period ending December 31, 1990. The sales offering price will be net book value, as determined by the company, plus a transaction charge of \$3.00. Customers purchasing CPE may elect to pay when the option to purchase is made, or be billed on their regular monthly bill. The number of installment payments is dependent upon the purchase price.

Alascom will warranty CPE that is sold for a period of 90 days from the date of purchase except for manufacturer disassembled equipment and equipment for which replacement parts are not available. Alascom would retain the right to repair, replace, or refund the purchase price.

As a default position, customers who do not notify the company of their intent will continue leasing the in place CPE, and will be responsible for all charges associated with their service.

In its application, Alascom requested that the Commission make the filing effective November 30, 1987. On November 12, 1987, the Commission suspended operation of the filing for further review and investigation.

If after investigation the Commission finds a rate or classification different from that proposed by Alascom is reasonable, the Commission may approve a rate or classification which varies from that proposed.

The filing may be inspected at the office of the Alaska Public Utilities Commission, 420 "L" Street, Suite 100, Anchorage, Alaska 99501-1987.

Any interested person may file a statement of views favoring or opposing this tariff filing with the Alaska Public Utilities Commission. Written comments will be considered by the Commission in determining the appropriate action to be taken, those comments will not serve to make the person a party to the proceeding. Any person wishing to become a party must file a petition to intervene in accordance with 5 AAC 48.110 of the Alaska Administrative Code.

To assure Commission consideration of comments or petitions prior to a final decision on this matter, those comments or petitions must be filed by December 21, 1987. Any statement filed with the Commission should clearly state that the interested person has filed a true copy of the statement with Alascom.

The project will consist of the construction of three offshore 74 foot diameter cellular sheet pile structures (cells). The cells will be located in an average water depth of 20 feet, will extend 25 feet above water and be driven to bedrock approximately 25 feet below the existing seabed. The work scope will also include the dredging within each cell of a layer of clay/sand material and the filling of the cell with crushed rock. The first cell will be located approximately 235 feet off the face of the existing shallow water dock and the last cell approximately 625 feet from the same dock face. Other work includes the placement of approximately 25 on shore H piles and approximately 35 offshore pile piles.

The estimated cost of construction is between five and ten million dollars.

All work shall be completed by July 1, 1989.
