

It Is Again Register Time For General

JUNEAU—Secretary of State Robert W. Ward reminded Alaskans that voter registration has begun again and voters may register for the November 3 general election up until midnight on October 20.

Ward urged all eligible voters to register as soon as possible if they have not already done so.

He added that eighteen-year-olds may register now for the November 3 general election, but the registrations will be held by the Election Supervisor's office until the constitutional amendment granting them the right to vote becomes effective.

The amendment will become effective 30 days after certification of the primary election results.

The election results probably will be certified around September 10, and, hence, the amendment will become effective around October 10.

Military families who are taking advantage of the provisions of the Soldiers and Sailors Relief Act are not eligible to vote in Alaska, Ward said.

To qualify for the advantages offered by the Relief Act, military personnel must sign an affidavit stating that they are not residents of the State of Alaska, he explained.
