

Forms 11-Member Council On Arts

Governor William A. Egan has named an 11-member Alaska State Council on the Arts to stimulate and encourage throughout the State the study and presentation of the performing, visual and fine arts.

As provided in Chapter 116 of the 1966 Session Laws of Alaska, the Governor designated Mrs. William (Geneva) Emmal of Fairbanks and William Kimura of Anchorage to serve as chairman and vice chairman, respectively, of the Council.

Both Mrs. Emmal and Kimura were appointed to three

year terms, expiring on June 24, 1969. Other members of the Council and the expiration date of their terms include:

Mrs. Louise Larsen, Seward, and Mrs. Richard (Judy) Whittaker, Ketchikan, both June 24, 1969; Ronald Senungetuk of Fairbanks; Mrs. Robert (Connie) Booschever of Juneau, Mrs. Eldor (Polly) Lee of Petersburg, and Fred Machetanz of Palmer, all June 24, 1968; and Lee H. The State has applied for an outright \$25,000 federal study grant and also a \$25,000 program grant from the National Endowment for the Arts. The latter funds will be matched equally by an appropriation authorized by the 1966 Legislature, with the Council determining the amounts to be allocated for projects throughout the State.

Under the provisions of AS 44.19.570, the Council is authorized to hold public and private hearings; to enter into contracts with individuals or organizations; and to accept gifts or contributions to further the educational objectives of its programs.
