

# Jean Mackin Appointed

Jean Mackin of Fairbanks has been appointed chairman of the Alaska State Council on the Arts by Governor Hammond. Mrs. Mackin has served on the council since its formation in 1967. During the past year she has been chairman of the Performing Arts Committee of the ASCA.

Mrs. Mackin has been active in the field of drama since her high school and college days. Before coming to Alaska she was involved with the founding of the Tyrone Guthrie Theatre in Minneapolis, Minn. She also worked in children's theatre in St. Paul.

Mrs. Mackin came to Alaska in 1961 and has been a board member of the Alaska Association for the Arts in Fairbanks and the Fairbanks Drama Association and has acted in several of their productions. She presently is a member of the ad hoc committee developing plans for a professional resident theatre company for Alaska.

Mrs. Mackin has also served as state president for Alaska Crippled Children and Adults since 1973.

The Alaska State Council on the Arts is a state agency in the Office of the Governor. It is

funded by the State of Alaska and the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency, to encourage and assist arts programming in all arts disciplines throughout the state.

The council consists of 11 members appointed by the Governor and maintains its offices in Anchorage
