Extends Deadline on

Off-Road Veh. The Bureau of Land Manage-

ment has extended until April 16 the deadline for receiving public comment on a proposal regarding possible restriction of off-road vehicles on lands administered by the BLM. The draft regulations pio-

posed administrative procedures to designate where off-road vehicles (such as snowmobiles) may or may not be permutted on such lands. Curtis V. McVee, Alaska state director of the BLM, said the extension was made due to nationwide public interest in the

proposed regulations. There is also a great deal of local interest, since numerous village residents use snowmobiles for routine transportation and

hunting. Most BLM lands Ш Maska are now open to off-road vehicle use and "our policy is to keep these lands open unless there is extensive resource damage or public interest in restricting offroad vehicle use in specific areas, MeVee said. Until final land regulations are in effect, designation of specific areas where off-road vehicles may be permitted can not be made.

The proposed regulations also The proposed regulations also make provisions for organized off-road vehicle events and attempt to set standards for vehicles and their operation on public lands. McVee said that BIM needs public help and comments to improve the proposed regulations. "To make them as responsive as possible for them as responsive as possible to

public needs."

For the purpose of the pro-posed regulations, an off-road vehicle is any vehicle deriving motive power from any source other than muscle and used off established roadways. "This in-cludes snowmobiles, the family car, four-wheel drive vehicles, motorcycles, all-terrain vehicles, and hovercraft, to name a few." McVee said. "Not included are military, for emergency of law enforcement vehicles or any vehicle whose use is expressly authorized under a BLM permit
