SUMMARIES OF ORDINANCES INTRODUCED BEFORE THE ASSEMBLY OF THE NORTH SLOPE BOROUGH AND TO BE CONSIDERED AT THE PUBLIC HEARING TO BE HELD AT BARROW, ALASKA IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NOTICE OF SAID HEARING ON MAY 7, 1974.

Summary of Ordinance 73-38: The ordinance is a non-code ordinance. The ordinance amends Section 5 of Ordinance 73-3A of the North Slope Borough and appropriates: the sum of \$250,000.00 for classrooms for the high school program to be included in the North Slope Borough Administration Building; the sum of \$500,000.00 for a vocational education building (interim use as a temporary administration building).

Summary of Ordinance 74-5: The ordinance is a non-code ordinance. The ordinance adopts a long range capital improvements program and financial plan. It appropriates previously transferred from cities within the North Slope Borough; provides that appropriations and projects approved are contingent upon general fund receipts, federal and state aid and the scheduled bond elections. The ordinance provides for the appropriation of Areawide Funds and for construction dates for public roads, streets, sidewalks, watercourse and flood control projects; a total of \$39,152,000.00 is transferred or appropriated to the Capital Projects Fund from the General Fund for such projects; bond elections for such projects are scheduled as follows: June 1974 — \$2,900,000.00; October 1974 — \$2,300,000.00; October 1975 — \$2,246,000.00. The ordinance provides for the appropriation of a Public Housing and Economic Development Fund for such projects; bond elections for such projects are scheduled as follows: June 1974 — \$250,000.00; October 1974 — \$2,600,000.00; October 1975 — \$10,892,000.00. The ordinance provides for the appropriation of Areawide Funds for water facilities; a total of \$186,000.00 is to be transferred or appropriated to the Capital Projects Fund from the General Fund for such projects; bond elections for such projects are scheduled as follows: June 1974 — \$25,000.00; October 1975 — \$25,000.00; October 1976 — \$91,000.00. The ordinance provides for the appropriation of Areawide Funds for sewage treatment and disposal facilities; a total of \$186,000.00 is to be transferred or appropriated to the Capital Projects Fund from the General Fund for such projects; bond elections for such projects are scheduled as follows: June 1974 — \$25,000.00; October 1975 — \$25,000.00; October 1976 — \$91,000.00. The ordinance provides for the appropriation of Areawide Funds for police protection and jail facilities; a total of \$253,000.00 is to be transferred or appropriated to the Capital Projects Fund from the General Fund for such projects; a bond election for such projects is scheduled as follows: October 1976 — \$127,000.00. The ordinance provides for a down payment in all projects in accordance with North Slope Borough Ordinance 57.20.210. The ordinance provides for the assumption of responsibilities by the North Slope Borough Mayor for involvement of Federal, State and Local activities; submission of applications for such authorized projects; grants and aid; administrative action; and reports on the progress of the authorized projects.

Summary of Ordinance 74-7: The ordinance is a non-code ordinance. The ordinance authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds of the North Slope Borough, Alaska in an amount not to exceed \$2,900,000.00 for the purpose of paying the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, betterment, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of public roads, streets, sidewalks, water course and flood control facilities in the North Slope Borough; a proposition ratifying the authorization of said bonds shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the North Slope Borough at an election to be held June 10, 1974, said election to be held in accordance with the laws of the State of Alaska and applicable to ordinances of the North Slope Borough, Alaska. The ordinance provides that if the issuance of said bonds is ratified at the election: (1) all expenses incurred incident to the issuance and sale of the bonds shall be paid from the General Fund of the North Slope Borough, and be reimbursed from the proceeds of the bond sale; (2) the proceeds of the bond sale shall be paid into the Capital Projects Fund; (3) the Debt Service Fund shall be created so that principal and interest on said bonds may be paid when due; (4) the assembly of the North Slope Borough may issue bond anticipation notes; (5) the borough assembly may in its discretion issue said bonds and provide for the terms thereof by resolution.

Summary of Ordinance 74-8: The ordinance is a non-code ordinance. The ordinance authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds of the North Slope Borough, Alaska in an amount not to exceed the sum of \$250,000.00 for the purpose of paying the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, betterment, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of public housing in the North Slope Borough; a proposition ratifying the authorization of said bonds shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the borough, at an election to be held June 10, 1974, said election to be held in accordance with the laws of the State of Alaska and the applicable ordinance of the North Slope Borough. The ordinance provides that if the issuance of said bonds is ratified at the election: (1) all expenses incurred incident to the issuance and sale of the bonds shall be paid from the General Fund of the North Slope Borough, and be reimbursed from the proceeds of the bond sale; (2) the proceeds of the bond sale shall be paid into the Capital Projects Fund; (3) the Debt Service Fund shall be created so that principal and interest on said bonds may be paid when due; (4) the assembly of the North Slope Borough may issue bond anticipation notes; (5) the borough assembly may in its discretion issue said bonds and provide for the terms thereof by resolution. The ordinance provides further that said bonds may be additionally secured by a pledge of revenue derived from the operation of said housing.

Summary of Ordinance 74-9: The ordinance is a non-code ordinance. The ordinance authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds of the North Slope Borough, Alaska in an amount not to exceed the sum of \$25,000.00 for the purpose of paying the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, betterment, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of sewage treatment and disposal facilities in the North Slope Borough; a proposition ratifying the authorization of said bonds shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the North Slope Borough; a proposition ratifying the authorization of said bonds shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the borough, at an election, to be held June 10, 1974, said election to be held in accordance with the laws of the State of Alaska and the applicable ordinances of the North Slope Borough. The ordinance provides that if the issuance of said bonds is ratified at the election: (1) all expenses incurred incident to the issuance and sale of the bonds shall be paid from the General Fund of the North Slope Borough, and be reimbursed from the proceeds of the bond sale; (2) the proceeds of the bond sale shall be paid into the Capital Projects Fund; (3) the Debt Service Fund shall be created so that principal and interest on said bonds may be paid when due; (4) the assembly of the North Slope Borough may issue bond anticipation notes; (5) the borough assembly may in its discretion issue said bonds and provide for the terms thereof by resolution.
