The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby gives notice that public hearings will be held concerning tariff revisions TA29-98, TA30-98 and TA31-98 (Dockets U-74-8, U-74-9 and U-74-10 respectively) filed by RCA ALASKA COMMUNICATIONS, INC., on January 9, 1974.

Tariff Revision TA29-98 would increase the monthly rates for Rural Wire Telephone Service (Farmer Line). The new increased charges would be based on the distance of a subscriber from the utility's switching center. Residence one party rates would vary from \$22.50 per month to \$25.00 per month, and residence ten party rates would be from \$10.00 to \$25.00, the present rate being \$6.00 per month. Business service would cost somewhat more.

Tariff Revision TA30-98 proposes to delete the monthly \$35.00 charge to each village having a Rural Radio Telephone (Bush Telephone). The utility would introduce instead a usage charge on local calls. There would be a per minute charge of 10 cents with an initial period of 3 minutes (30 cents).

Tariff Revision TA31-98 consists of the following charges applicable to intrastate toll telephone service: (a) a general restructuring and reduction in the message mileage bands; (b) a new rate for subscriber-dialed calls; (c) an increase in the number of holidays when the low night rate would apply, to include Thanksgiving Day, Labor Day, Independence Day and Alaska Statehood Day; (d) deletion of the evening period rate classification and a change in the present night rate period of 7:00 P.M. to 7:00 A.M. Monday through Friday, to a new period of 8:00 P.M. to 8:00 A.M., Monday through Friday.

The applicant and protestants herein and other interested parties will be afforded an opportunity to offer testimony and evidence for the record either in support of or against each of the referenced tariff revisions at the following scheduled hearing times and locations:
