NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT REGULATIONS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Notice is given that the Division of Economic Development, Department of Commerce and Economic Development, under the authority of AS 44.38.020(1), proposes to adopt regulations in Title 3 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with identification seals and emblems for handicrafts produced in Alaska, to implement AS 45.65.101-.070, as follows:

1.) The SILVER HAND seal is exclusively for the identification of Alaskan Native handicrafts; the MADE IN ALASKA emblem can be utilized to identify any product or handicraft, art object or other similar article may apply to use the SILVER HAND seal or the MADE IN ALASKA emblem, subject to meeting certain eligibility criteria requirements.

2.) The regulations establish: (a) eligibility criteria for persons to use the SILVER HAND seal on their handicrafts; (b) eligibility for products to display the MADE IN ALASKA emblem; (c) limitations and restrictions on the utilization of the seal or the emblem; (d) eligibility criteria for persons wishing to be agents for either the SILVER HAND or MADE IN ALASKA programs; and (e) application fees for authorization to use the SILVER HAND seal and MADE IN ALASKA emblem and for persons wishing to be SILVER HAND or MADE IN ALASKA agents.

3) Any authorization or permit to use the SILVER HAND seal, to act as a SILVER HAND agent, or to use the MADE IN ALASKA emblem made prior to the effective date of these regulations will become

declared null and void. Persons holding such permits will have 60 days to reapply under the new regulations.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

Notice is also given that any person may present written statements or arguments relevant to the proposed action by writing to the Director, Division of Economic Development, Department of Commerce and Economic Development, 3601 C Street, Suite 724, Anchorage, AK 99503, so that they are received no later than May 5, 1993.

NOTICE OF UTILITY TARIFF FILING

The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby gives notice that GCI COMMUNICATION CORP (GCICC), an interexchange telecommunications utility, has proposed a tariff revision (TA21-419) to modify its 800 Service offering by deleting volume discounts, adding a flat discount option and adding a special promotional offering.

GCICC proposes to add the option of a flat 10% discount for a monthly recurring fee of \$2.00. As a special promotional offering GCICC proposes to waive the \$2.00 per month fee through April 30, 1994.

GCICC proposes to delete the following language regarding volume discounts from its 800 service offering:

If the customer's total monthly 800 Service bill does not exceed \$ 50.00, then no additional discounts are provided. After accumulating a total 800 Service bill of \$50.00, the participating customer receives an additional 5% off 800 Service rates on the amount over \$50.00 and up to \$100.00. After accumulating a total 800 Service bill of \$100.00, the participating customer receives an additional 7% off 800 Service rates on the amount over \$100.00 and up to \$150.00. After accumulating a total 800 Service bill of \$150.00, the participating customer receives an additional 10% off 800 Service rates on all additional calls.

If the Commission finds that the rates proposed by GCICC are not just and reasonable, the Commission may approve a rate or classification which

varies from that proposed.

Detailed information may be obtained from the utility whose address is 2550 Denali, Suite 1000, Anchorage, Alaska 99503-2781. The filing may be inspected at the offices of the Alaska Public Utilities Commission, 1016 West Sixth Avenue, Suite 400, Anchorage, Alaska 99501.

Any interested person may file a statement of views favoring or opposing this tariff filing with the Alaska Public Utilities Commission. If you are a person with a disability who may need a special accommodation, auxiliary aid, or service or alternative communication format in order to comment on the proposed tariff revision, please contact Pat Oldenburg at 263-2107 by 4:30 p.m., April 15, 1993, to make any necessary arrangements.

To assure Commission consideration of comments or petitions prior to a final decision on this matter, those comments or petitions must be filed by April 22, 1993. Any statement filed with the Commission should clearly affirm that the interested person has filed a true copy of the statement with GCICC.

While comments will be considered by the Commission in determining the appropriate action to be taken, those comments will not serve to make the person a party to the proceeding. Any person wishing to become a party must file a petition to intervene in accordance with 3 AAC 48.110 of the Alaska Administrative Code.

YOU ARE HEREBY SUMMONED to a hearing on this petition which will be held before the Superior Court for the State of Alaska, Courtroom C, Barrow, Alaska on May 25, 1993, at 9:00 a.m. You have the right to be represented by counsel at the hearing. You are advised under 25 USC 1912(a) that this hearing will not be held until at least 10 days after receipt of notice by you and that you may have, upon request, an additional 20 days to prepare for the proceeding.

You are advised that if the court finds the child named above to be a child in need of aid then it will have the power to order the child committed to the custody of the Department of Health and Social Services for a period of time not to exceed two years. The court has the power to terminate the relationship of parent and child.

While pumping fuel through the community pipeline to the Alaska Village Electric Cooperative's tank farm in Scammon Bay, Alaska Village Electric Cooperative's records indicate that approximately 197 gallons of fuel leaked from the pipeline. The United States Coast Guard has designated Alaska Village Electric Cooperative, Inc. as one of the sources for this fuel spill.
