to Deermount St. described herein,

vailing time, January 6, 1972 in the
Commissioner's Office, Department
of Highways, Island Center Building
Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of grad-
ing, drainage, highway illumination,
and hot bituminous pavement on
0.47 miles of roadway in Ketchikan,
Alaska. Included in the work will be
a prestressed concrete girder viaduct
and a reinforced concrete extension
to the existing Federal Building
parking lot.

Principal items of work consist of
the following: 9,600 cubic yards of
Unclassified Excavation; 3,750 tons
of Crushed Aggregate Base; 5,600
tons of Subbase B; 1,930 tons of
Hot Bituminous Pavement; 118 tons
of 120-150 Penetration Asphalt and
12 tons of MC-30 Prime; approxi-
mately 1,500 cubic yards of Class A
Concrete, lump sum, all required;
approximately 272,000 pounds of
Reinforcing Steel, lump sum, all re-
quired; 1,760 linear feet of Steel
Pipe Piles; 2,700 linear feet of Pres-
tressed Concrete Beams; 2,300 linear
feet of Structural Steel Piles; 6,700
tons of Borrow; 3,800 square yards
of Concrete Sidewalk; 5,700 linear

the Alaska Administrative Code to implement, interpret, and make specific AS
40.15.070, AS 40.15.075 and AS 40.15.140 as follows:

1. All plats submitted to the Division of Lands shall contain the following
certificates:

a. Surveyor's Certificate:
SURVEYOR'S CERTIFICATE
I hereby certify that I am registered to practice land surveying in Alaska and
that this plat represents a survey made by me or under my direct supervision, and
the monuments shown thereon actually exist as located, and that all dimensional
and other details are correct.

b. Certification of Approval by the State:
CERTIFICATION OF APPROVAL BY THE STATE

I hereby certify that the plat of survey shown hereon has been found to
comply with the survey requirements of the State of Alaska and is approved for
recording in the office of the Recorder.

2. Any entity or person seeking to replat, change or vacate shall initiate the
request for such action by filing an original petition and one copy of a survey plat
showing the area of the petition request with the director, Division of Lands.

3. (a) The name of the petitioner or petitioners and land ownership relevant
to the petition.

(b) A brief factual statement in support of the petition including, but not
limited to, a description of the land involved and the reasons in support of the
action or relief asked for in the petition.

(d) The name and address of a petitioner or attorney for the petitioners
designated to receive service.

4. A filing fee in the amount of \$25 and an additional fee in the amount of
\$100 to cover advertising, recording and other costs shall accompany the
petition. Any unused portion of the additional fee shall be returned to the
petitioners.

5. (a) The division shall send a copy of the petition to applicable public
agencies, utility companies, and all affected landowners not joining the petition,
within a radial distance of 500 feet, requesting comments within three weeks.

(b) The division shall publish a notice one week for three consecutive weeks
in a newspaper of general circulation, published within the largest governing
district in which the land is located or posted in the local post office or other
places of general visitation.

(c) If a public hearing is warranted, the hearing shall be held in an applicable
district office or recording office or other places so designated by the director,
and shall be published in the news media to that effect giving pending action,
time and place.

6. (a) If the petition is accepted and approved, the division shall execute a
state platting resolution to that effect and shall be sent to the petitioners
together with a notice indicating an amended plat must be constructed by a
registered surveyor or a registered engineer and submitted to the division. A
preliminary plat may be requested prior to final platting. The plat shall be
constructed at the petitioner's expense.

(b) In the case of section line vacating, the following certificate shall be
included on the plat.

**SECTION LINE EASEMENT
VACATION CERTIFICATE**

The State of Alaska, acting by and through the Commissioner of the
Department of Natural Resources and the Commissioner of the Department of
Highways, does hereby state and declare that the State of Alaska vacates and
releases all right and title to any and all portions of section line easements and
public highways reserved to it under Alaska Statute 19.10.010 with the
subdivision depicted herein.

(c) Once the plat is approved, the division shall send the plat and resolution
out for recording. After recording, the division shall maintain the originals. All
petitioners shall be notified of the final action and may request copies of the plat
at a cost.

(d) If the petition is rejected, all applicable parties shall be notified and
reasons why stated and no state platting resolution shall be executed.

7. Title to vacated areas shall be handled in accordance with AS 40.15.180.

statements or arguments relevant to the action proposed at the hearings to be
