Rural Housing Income Upped

Jerry W. Glor, district di-rector for Alaska for the Farm-ers Home Administration, an-nounces that the income limit for Rural Housing Loans has

been increased.

Effective immediately families in Alaska, anywhere except Anchorage and Fairbanks, who have an adjusted family income

have an adjusted family income of less than \$20,500 are now eligible for a 100% loan. The adjusted income is figured by taking the gross income minus 5%, minus \$300 per child.

Glor says these loans are available to build or buy a modest home in a rural area. Homes average 1000-11000 and the present terms are 40 years at 9% interest. at 9% interest.

The Farmers Home Administration can only finance homes in approved subdivisions. Build-ers, developers and others who are interested in building homes under the Farmers Home Administration program should contact the local office serving their area.

Wainwright Center

WASHINGTON-A new Wainwright, Alaska community water and sewer treatment center moved one step closer to completion when the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) decided that funds for completion of the project will soon be made available

The new community water and sewer treatment center will be similar to one that was destroyed by fire in November, 1973.

That center, part of the Alaska Village Demonstration Project that sought to provide safe, pure drinking water, bathing facilities, laundry facilities, and sewage treatment capabilities to remote Alaska villages, was only months old when flames claimed it.

Shortly after the fire, the EPA decided to erect a new center in the village, but problems arose. Sen. Mike Gravel, D-Alaska, was recently advised those problems have all been eliminated and construction should get under way sometime Thanksgiving.

Gravel was engaged in an effort to get legislation for a new Wain wright center through Congress when he learned the EPA had cleared up roadblocks to the project and was proceeding. Gravel, who has been involved in the project eines he first

in the project since he first learned of the Wainwright villagers were having getting a new center, said he was pleased to hear that the facility

would be completed.


