clamation Project was constructed over 70 years ago, water has been diverted from the lake's only source - the Truckee River. "Clearly, the legal rights of the Indians to water were never considered. It appears that the Justice Department's case may

not have been framed in such a way as to best protect these

rights.
"I will personally study the pleadings of the Justice Department because I have seen in the past the Government of advocacy become the Government of opposition when Indian Rights are involved," the Senator concluded by saying that he is considering introducing legislation
