the fuel and prevented contamination of the surrounding area. Vandalism and destruction of

property are inexcusable, LeDosquet said, and shooting at full drums of fuel could have

touched off a fire or explosion. He said that in the future,

BLM will try to locate fuel caches in areas more remote from the highway or better protected.
