WASHINGTON—The federal government has awarded almost \$3 million for assistance to Native education in the Alaska bush, Sen. Mike Gravel announced last week.

The grants are made by the Bureau of Indian Affairs under the Johnson-O'Malley education program. The money will help pay for basic educational services.

The funds are being distributed as follows:

Cook Inlet Native Association, Anchorage—\$1,021,792; Nome City School District, Nome—\$248,763; Sand Point J.O.M. Native Parent Committee, Sand Point—\$40,299; North Slope Borough School District, Barrow—\$399,845; Ninilchik Native Association, Ninilchik—\$11,094; Galena City School District, Galena—\$49,434; Dillingham City School District, Dillingham—\$104,233; North Pacific Rim, Anchorage—\$66,438; Bering Straits School District, Nome—\$116,958; Northwest Arctic School District, Kotzebue—\$472,512; Bristol Bay Native Association, Dillingham—\$66,963; Kodiak Area Native Association, Kodiak—\$271,210; Kivalina J.O.M. School District, Kivalina—\$33,384, and Bidarki Corporation, Cordova—\$62,100.
