Notice is hereby given that the Department of Commerce, under authority vested by AS 45.55.240, proposes to amend regulations in title 3 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement AS 45.55.040(f) and AS 45.55.140(a)(11), as follows:

(a) 3 AAC 08.020 is amended by adding a new provision which registered agents, as well as registered broker-dealers and investment advisers, to post a surety bond, in the amount of \$5,000, with the administrator. This conforms with AS 45.55.040(f) which currently provides all registered broker-dealers, investment advisers, and agents shall file the bond.

(2) 3 AAC 08.310(1) is amended as follows:

Not-for-private-profit issuers shall file a notice with the Administrator at least 30 days prior to the making of any offers or sales of securities; the notice shall contain a ruling or determination by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service in recognition of the issuers' exempt status under section 501(c) (3) or 501(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or such other documentation as the Administrator may require including, but not limited to, certified financial statements; by-laws and Articles of Incorporation; plan of financing; plan of operation; use of proceeds; background of officers and directors (or principles if unincorporated);
