

Calista Corp. to Elect Permanent Board of Directors

BETHEL — A permanent board of directors will be elected at the first annual meeting of stockholders of the Calista Corporation set for 9 a.m., Sunday, Sept. 15, 1974 in the Bethel Regional High School. Ten of the directors will be elected as one from each of Calista's administrative units. Three directors will be elected at large.

A nominating committee is receiving names of persons who wish to be listed as candidates for these offices. Requirements for candidates include the fol-

- lowing:
- each candidate shall be a shareholder at least 19 years of age.
 - each candidate shall be eligible for election to only one administrative unit position or one at-large position.
 - each candidate must sub-

mit in writing, a brief resume and short statement of goals and objectives concerning how the candidate would assist the Calista Corporation.

Applicants must submit this information — names, resumes, and statements of goals and objectives — in time to be received

by the Nominating Committee of the corporation by the close of business July 25, 1974. They are to be sent to 516 Denali Street, Anchorage, 99501.

The nominating committee has the sole responsibility to screen applicants, using corporate criteria established by the Calista Board of Directors.

Fishing Closure

The Alaska Department of Fish and Game announced that commercial salmon fishing in the Tanana River, subdistrict Y-6 of the Yukon District will be closed effective 6 p. m. Saturday, July 20, 1974.

A department spokesman said that the 1,000 king salmon catch quota for this subdistrict, as adopted last fall by the Alaska Board of Fish and Game, has been taken.

The closure of subdistrict Y-6 applies only to commercial salmon fishing however, 'all fishermen' including subsistence fishermen must remove their nets from the water or stop their fish wheels from turning for 24 hours following the 6 p. m. closure Saturday. Fishermen may resume fishing for subsistence purposes at 6 p. m. Sunday, July 21.

The department will announce the opening of the second season in the Tanana River subdistrict when it has been determined that the remainder of the king salmon run has been passed the area on to spawning grounds.
