

Until the Election

After the Capital Site Selection Study is formally completed, Alaskans will have ample time to consider each of the sites selected by the Capital Site Selection Committee. The committee will prepare descriptive reports on each site for distribution throughout the state. In addition, Alaskans will have the opportunity to make their views on these sites known during public hearings in each judicial district of the state.

The three sites recommended to the voters on December 11, 1975, will meet all of the requirements of Initiative I with respect

to accessibility, size and land availability. The sites will also represent the areas considered by the committee to have the highest potential for development. Then, it is for the people of Alaska to weigh the unique and common advantages of each site to determine which best meets their needs. Alaskans will cast their votes on November 2, 1976, for a capital site they can use easily and with pleasure and pride, a capital that will benefit the state for generations to come.
