

Bill to Rid Impediments on Fishing Loan Prog.

JUNEAU — Governor William A. Egan said today that a bill to remove federal impediments

hindering the state's commercial fishing loan program has at his request been introduced in Con-

gress by Alaska Senator Mike Gravel.

The bill will amend the federal Ship Mortgage Act of 1920 to enable the state to obtain a first lien on boats being put up as loan collateral, as is required by state law.

In most cases the only first

lien available is a preferred ship mortgage created and held in accordance with the federal act, which requires that the holder be a United States citizen.

"Since a state is nowhere defined as being a citizen," Egan said, "the proposed legislation will correct that oversight and enable states to create and hold preferred ship mortgages."

The successful bidder will be required to furnish and pay for satisfactory performance and payment bonds, each in the amount of not less than fifty percent (50%) of the contract amount.

Attention is called to the fact that not less than the minimum salaries and wages set forth in the specifications must be paid on this project.

No bid shall be considered responsive unless all items as outlined in the scope of work are included.

The Alaska State Housing Authority reserves the right to reject any or all bids or waive any informalities thereto.

No bid shall be withdrawn for a period of thirty days (30) after the time for opening bids without the consent of the Alaska State Housing Authority.
