

CITC takes over JOM program

The Johnson-O'Malley program previously contracted through the Cook Inlet Native Association is now administered through the Cook Inlet Tribal Council, Inc. Although the contract has transferred, the JOM programs offered in the past remain the same. The office of the Johnson-O'Malley program is still located at 670 W. Fireweed Lane, and the phone number remains the same, 265-1275.

The JOM program serves Native students ages three years through high school with emphasis in both academic improvement as well as cultural awareness.

The Education Division is composed of eight tutors, two alternative Counselors and three Home/School Coordinators. The Education Division's goal is to see each student succeed academically in the school system.

The Special Program Division is composed of five programs that include: Native Dress Review, Native Youth Leadership, Native Youth Art Show, Native Youth Olympics, Cultural Resources Program, and Summer Camp NaDunae. Special Programs provide the students with experience in the cultural aspect of their education.
