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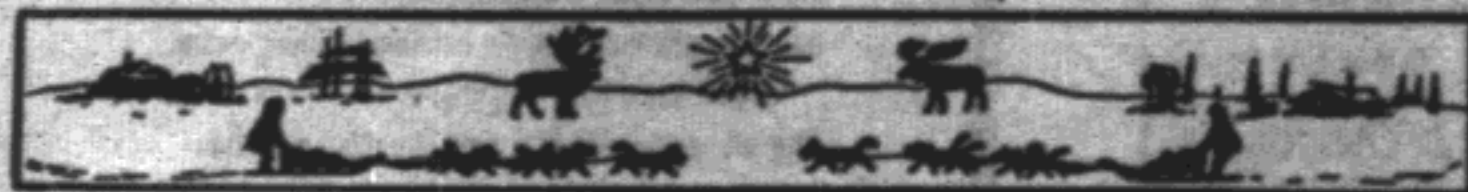

Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, material, and equipment and performing all work for Project F-011-1(5), Kodiak—Naval Air Station, described herein, will be received until 11:00 a.m., PST., August 17, 1967, in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project consists of grading, drainage and hot bituminous pavement of 2,788 miles of roadway on the Island of Kodiak, State of Alaska. Also included in construction will be utility adjustments and an Illumination System.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 42,266 cubic yards of unclassified excavation; 10,600 cubic yards of structure excavation; 23,600 tons of crushed aggregate base; 11,900 tons of subbase material; 5,500 tons of hot bituminous pavement; 197 cubic yards of Class A Concrete; 7,900 linear feet of guard rail; 7,076 linear feet of curb and gutter; 2,910 linear feet of 8" Asbestos-Cement Pipe, Class 150; 3,022 linear feet of 8" Asbestos-Cement Pipe, Class 1500; approximately 300 tons of 200-300 penetration Asphalt Cement; and miscellaneous items of work. All work shall be completed by October 1, 1968.

INVITATION FOR BIDS STATE OF ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS

Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment, and performing all work for Project F-FG-037-2(14), Anchorage Fairbanks Highway, 1.4 Miles N. of Nenana River Bridge No. 2 to North Approach of Nenana River Bridge No. 3, described herein will be received until 11:00 a.m., PST., August 8, 1967; in the Commissioner's Office, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project consist of grading and drainage of 5.15 miles of the Anchorage-Fairbanks Highways, and 0.51 miles of McKinley Park Access Road in McKinley National Park, approximately 30 miles north of Cantwell, Alaska. Included in the construction will be two composite steel and concrete bridges 225 feet and 500 feet long respectively, and a steel girder underpass 240 feet long. Composite structures will have a clear width of 30 feet and the steel girder structure will have 18 feet clear width to accommodate the Alaska Railroad Tracks over the highway.

Principal items of work consists of the following: 618,500 cubic yards of unclassified excavation; 26,300 cubic yards of subbase materials; 1,600 linear feet of pipe conduit ranging between 18 inch and 36 inch diameter; 858,000 square feet of hydro-seeding; Furnishing and Planting 1,620 Trees; 1,760 Class I, Excavation for Structures; Class A concrete 2,100 cubic yards; 334,000 pounds of Reinforcing Steel; 1,300 linear feet of Mainline and Shaffly Trackwork; 826,000 pounds of Structural Steel; and miscellaneous roadway and bridge items. All work shall be completed by July 31, 1969.
