NOTICE OF PROPOSED ADOPTION OF REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS

NOTICE is given that the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, under authority of AS 26.10.010 proposes to adopt regulations in Title 10 of the Alaska Administrative Code (AAC), dealing with the reimbursement of veteran's service organizations for the employment of service officers. AS 26.10.040 — AS 26.10.050, as follows:

The proposed regulations add a new Chapter 10 to Title 10 of the AAC relating to the reimbursement of veteran's service organizations for the employment of service officers. The proposed regulations provide for reimbursement to be accomplished through grants. The proposed regulations provide for a competitive process in which interested organizations will submit written proposals and make oral presentations to a grant awards advisory board. The board will evaluate the written proposals and the oral presentations and will make recommendations to the Director, Division of Veterans Affairs, as to the amount of money to be granted. The final decision will be made by the Director. An appeal procedure is provided by the proposed regulations. The proposed regulations limit reimbursement to organizations chartered by the Congress of the United States. The proposed regulations require organizations to account for expenditures of money received for reimbursement.

NOTICE OF UTILITY TARIFF FILING

The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby given notice that ALASCOM, INC. (Alascom), a long line telecommunications utility, has filed two tariff revisions (TA 267-98 and TA 268-98) to reduce its rates. Alascom requests that the decreases become effective on a permanent basis on March 18 1990.

In TA 267-98 Alascom requests the following:

- * that the rates identified as "Dial Station, Customer Dialed Calling Card Station, Operator Station and Person-to-Person" be reduced;
- * that the decrease become effective on a permanent basis on March 18, 1990;
- * that the rate adjustment ordered by the Commission in Order 28 in Docket U-87-25 be delayed and made simultaneously with the requested decrease in TA267-98; and
- * that one page of one supporting exhibit filed with TA267-98 be treated as proprietary.

In TA268-98 Alascom requests the following:

- * that most rates in its optional calling plans (Reach In Alaska and Call Alaska) be reduced; and
- * that the decrease become effective on March 18, 1990, coincident with the compliance filing in Docket U-87-25 and TA267-98.

Alascom does not propose any reductions in the service charges for calling card and operator assisted calls below those ordered by the Commission in Order 28 in docket U-87-25.

The following chart shows two sets of rates for daytime customer dialed station telephone calls: the first set shows the rates filed by Alascom as compliance with Order 28 in Docket U-87-25, the second set reflects the rates proposed by Alascom in TA267-98.

If after investigation the Commission finds a rate or classification different from that proposed by Alascom is reasonable, the Commission may approve a rate or classification which varies from that filed.

While comments will be considered by the Commission in determining the appropriate action to be taken, they will not serve to make the person a party of the proceeding. Any person wishing to become a party must file a petition to intervene in accordance with 3 AAC 48.110 of the Alaska Administrative Code.

To assure Commission consideration of comments or petitions prior to a final decision on this matter, they must be filed by April 9, 1990. Any comments filed with the Commission should clearly affirm that the interested person has filed a true copy of the statement with Alascom.
