"The hearing was held from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. Attorney General Boyko done a real good job of testifying on behalf of the Natives as well as Roger Connor and Barry Jackson."

"Tyonek is real proud of those mentioned and would especially like to thank Governor Hickel for his swift action."

"The only bad thing about the trip was rain, and more rain. We were lucky to get 5 minutes of sunshine in Juneau and some good pictures."

BIA Awards Flood Workers

Sixteen people received commendations and awards from the Bureau of Indian Affairs Wednesday.

Volunteers Agnes Mayo, Maynard Eakon, Thomas Stump and Allen Donnelly, who worked under BIA direction during the flood, received letters of commendation signed by Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Robert L. Bennett.

BIA Fairbanks Agency employees received monetary awards with letters of commendation signed by Owen D. Morken, BIA Area Director at the time of the flood. They

He is presently Tribal Operations Officer for the BIA Fairbanks Agency and a member of the Board of Directors of the Tundra Times. Mr. Three Stars hails from Pine Ridge, S. Dak., and is a full-blooded Sioux. He has been in Alaska since 1958 and worked in Southeastern Alaska and at Unalakleet, where he was a teacher.
