This project will consist of construction of 1,200 feet of approaches and a 110 foot pre-stressed concrete bridge across Willow Creek. The project is located at Mile 35.2 on the Willow-Fishhook Road, State of Alaska.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 4,100 cubic yards of unclassified excavation; 4,500 cubic yards of selected material; four (4) 106 foot pre-stressed concrete girders; 300 linear feet of structural steel piles and 1,995 square feet of structural steel sheet piles; Class A concrete and reinforcing steel, lump sum, all required (approximately 45 cubic yards and 4,500 pounds respectively); 219 linear feet of bridge rail and 250 linear feet of beam type guardrail; and items of work.

All work shall be completed in 160 calendar days.
