Slaughter of American Eagle

BUFFALO, Wyo.—(AIPA)—A
few months ago, a mass murder
was committed. The slaughter

American eagle. Several hundred
of them, bald and golden,
were shot by ranchers over Wyoming
and Colorado.

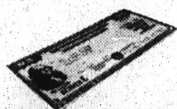
The crime was brought to
light when a helicopter pilot,
James O. Vogan, before the
Senate Environmental Subcommittee,
told the story after he
had been granted immunity.

Vogan revealed that he had
flown hunters and ranchers to
kill not only eagles but antelope,
elk, deer, and Canadian geese—all
of which, are protected by law.

Some of the people who went
paid \$10 to \$25 for each eagle
killed while others killed just for
fun.

Vogan also said that many of
the eagles were shot over the
Wyoming ranch of Herman Werner
who had paid \$10,000 and later
\$5,000 for the kills to Doyle Vaughn,
operator of the Flying Buffalo Service,
Buffalo, Wyoming.
