

Kay Appeals for United Democrats

Wendell P. Kay, Democratic candidate for the United States Senate, indicated that a united effort would be necessary to elect state-wide Democratic candidates in November.

Kay said, "It is going to take a concerted team effort to elect Bill Egan and Red Boucher, Nick Begich and Wendell Kay in the general election. If we don't stick together, we are going to get stuck separately."

Kay pointed out that, "every Republican candidate, and particularly Ted Stevens, picked up votes they would not have received if the voters had known

where these men stood on the issues. We have an absolute obligation to make the issues clear-cut, and to see that the people know exactly where these Republicans stand and where we stand. Only then, can the voters take an informed position."

Among the important issues to be considered, Kay listed unemployment, the high cost of living, inflation, continued war, high interest rates, a land claims settlement, pollution control, and issuance of a pipeline permit.

"On every issue these Republican candidates have failed to be effective," Kay concluded.
