opposed the Woods Can-yon Dam Project on the Copper River on grounds that it would flood lands below 1,000 feet, from Chitina to Copper Center, destroy salmon fishing and spawning in the Canyon River tributaries and a new bridge across the Copper River at Chitina, upset migrating wildlife and cause Native allotments in the area not to be processed.


